When the present management took over the Pelican Cafe, in the spring of 1933, it was a general restaurant, just as it is now. Beer had just been introduced into dry Oregon, so the downstairs room of the Pelican was opened as the Silver Spur and dedicated by the big American Legion convention of August, 1933.

In early 1934, the Spur burned and was not rebuilt until 1941 as the Party Room. In the hallway downstairs, and in the bar, may still be seen the charred knotty pine walls, sandblasted to give their present weathered effect. In May 1935, Lucile Warner joined us with her non-pareil pie baking, which has made the Pelican famous all over the country for its fine pastry. In December of that year she agreed to take over the management of the kitchen, bringing to the job experience gained in Portland, Seaside and Eugene.

By 1938 the Pelican had worked into an all woman personnel believing that simple, but good, American cooking, is most pleasing to the greatest number of people most of the time. In July 1946, the Pelican kitchen was enlarged and modernized, and the Candy Jar was added to our services, featuring choice candies, our own Klamath Sugar Plums, and a selection of native wild fruit jellies and preserves with Wild Plum Preserves at the top of the list. These are now shipped in gift packages all over the United States. In 1953, liquor by the drink made its bow into Oregon. Our cheerful bar-room, in use in 1933 for beer, and from 1941 on for private parties only, was now opened to the public under the name of the Pelican Wing. A corner of the party room was screened into a home-like attractive lounge where card parties may gather and luncheon or dinner groups, may relax over a cocktail. Only luncheons or dinners of 50 or less can now be accommodated in the Party Room, except for buffet service. Here, as in our main dining room, we hope to serve the best food possible in a warm and friendly atmosphere.

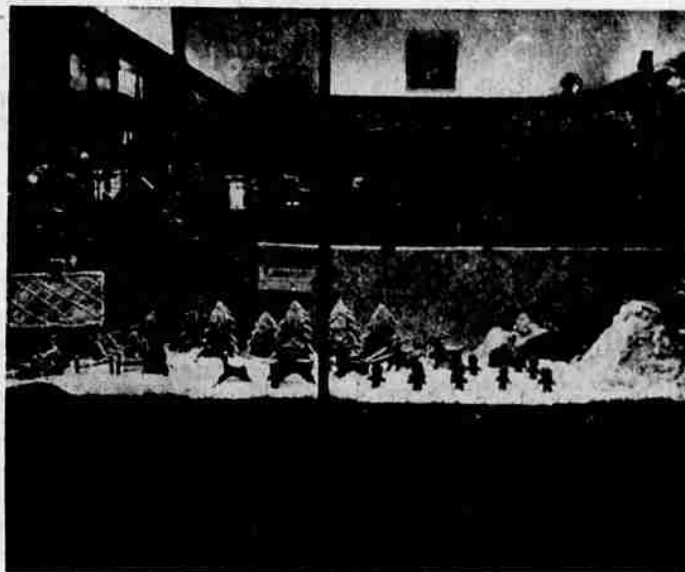
