Tear Gas Used On Doukhobors

GRAND FORKS, B. C. (AP)—Fifteen Royal Canadian Mounted policemen escorting a truant officer were attacked by 50 stone-throwing Sons of Freedom Doukhobor women near here yesterday and were forced to use tear gas to drive them off.

Four of the women were arrested on assault charges, immediately taken to Nelson, B. C., 60 miles to the northeast, tried and sentenced to two months in jail.

The fracas occurred at Gilpin, a Freedomist settlement, when the Mounties accompanied Ralph McIntosh into the town so he could read a proclamation.

McIntosh lost an encounter with 20 male women who scratched and clawed him Wednesday when he

attempted to read his proclamation ordering the villagers to send their children to school.

The Sons of Freedom sect objects to sending children to Canadian schools on the grounds the schools teach militarism.

Yesterday, McIntosh and the policemen returned in patrol cars, and were rushed and stoned as they left the autos. The Mounties retaliated with a barrage of tear gas and then made the four arrests.

Marines Change Recruit Policy

Siaff Sergeant William M. Allen, local Marine Corps recruiting sergeant, reports a new change in Marine Corps policy affecting the current two-year active duty program.

The effective termination date of the present two-year program is set for June 30, according to Allen. Thereafter, all enlistments in both the regular Marine Corps and the Marine Corps reserve will be for a minimum of three years.

At the same time Sgt. Allen also states that a unit of Marine recruits, to be known as the Pelican Leather Necks, will be formed and accepted into the Marine Corps on June 8, and will leave Klamath Falls, on June 6. Men can still enlist into this unit under the two year program.

Application for this unit should be made prior to June 4 to ensure membership, as the men will be sworn into the Marine Corps on June 8. The Leather Neck recruiter urges all young men interested in this unit, to contact him at the Marine Corps Recruiting Station at the Klamath County Courthouse.
