FREDERICK, Md. (AP)—Wilbert H. Reinhardt, 47-year-old city electrician, escaped electrocution for the second time in 12 years last night.

Sixty-seven hundred volts flowed into Reinhardt's right index finger and out his right big toe, causing third degree burns to both members.

Prompt action by city electrician Max Kehne who saw Reinhardt slump in his safety belt was credited with saving his life. While still high above the ground on the small platform attached to the pole, Kehne applied artificial respiration.

Twelve years ago, while working for the Potomac Edison Co., Reinhardt was victim of a similar accident.

Segregation Big Issue In Election

RALEIGH, N.C. (AP) — North Carolinians voted today in Democratic primaries in which the segregation issue, pointed up by the Supreme Court's decision banning separation of white and Negro pupils in public schools, played a vital role in the final week of the senatorial race.

The unsigned leaflets, admittedly prepared by a newspaper advertisement which warmly praised Scott as a friend of the Negro, flooded the state's eastern rural areas.

Actually, Sen. Alton A. Lennon and former Gov. W. Kerr Scott, probably the strongest of his six opponents, stood shoulder to shoulder in calling for the maintenance of segregated public schools.

However, in the final hours of campaigning thousands of leaflets, reprints of a newspaper advertisement which warmly praised Scott as a friend of the Negro, flooded the state's eastern rural areas.

In addition to the senatorial race, there were contests in five of the state's congressional districts, races for two superior court judgeships, nine superior court solicitors, state insurance commissioner, and for the state treasurer's office. There also were local races for state house and senate and for county posts.

The contests were confined to the Democratic party, where nomination is tantamount to election in North Carolina. There were no Republican primaries.

In the congressional races, Rep. L. H. Fountain of Tarboro was opposed by Herbert T. Bailey of Tarboro in the 2nd District; Rep. Carl T. Durham by H.C. Sprinkle of Durham in the 6th; Rep. F. Ertel Carlyle by Seavy Carroll of Fayetteville in the 7th; Rep. C. B. Deane by Coble Funderburk of Monroe in the 8th; and in the 10th J. C. Seeberry and Marvin Rich of Charlotte battled for Democratic nomination. Rep. Charles R. Jorgis, the state's only Republican congressman, represents the 10th.

Juvenile Vice Probe Planned

An early grand jury probe of juvenile vice in Klamath Falls seemed certain Saturday.

County Juvenile Officer Francis Mathews said he will recommend that the grand jury probe a series of sex parties involving two 15-year-old girls and 22 boys, eight of them over 18 years old.

For the past week, Mathews and Juvenile Officer Faye Blackmer have been taking statements from boys named by the two girls held in the juvenile home.

According to the officers, many of the boys involved are high school athletes.

It is known that Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg plans to call the grand jury back into session after his return Monday from Prineville, where he has been presiding at a civil trial.

What Mathews described as deplorable immoral conduct by teenagers was brought to light after state police broke up a sex party in a parked automobile. They said they found two boys and a girl in the car. The girl was nude.

Both the girls held at the juvenile home have made lengthy statements in which they admitted relations with 22 boys.

Young Boy Held For Car Theft

A 12 year old boy was turned over to juvenile officers shortly after midnight when he was apprehended while driving a stolen car, city police reported this morning.

The car, reported stolen earlier in the evening, was seen traveling on Washburn Way by its co-workers Irvin Edge Jr., and Jack Lively. After the car turned onto Parahung Way, Lively who was driving the other car, bumped the back of a bumper of the fleeing car in such a way that the two bumpers locked and by applying his brakes, brought both cars to a stop.

The 12 year old lad was held until police officers arrived.

Darlington Hoopes, of Reading, Pa., Socialist candidate for President in 1952 and national party chairman, also will speak.

The keynote address will be delivered by Dr. Caleb Smith, professor of economics at Brown University. His topic is "The Coming American Recession."

SENTENCED HONG KONG (AP) — Forty-eight Chinese resistance workers have been sentenced to death in Hui China, the Communist paper Hui Daily reported Saturday. It said 11 others received life terms and sentences and 36 workers were suspended for two years.
