S.O. Phillips Dies Sunday

TULELAKE — Samuel O. Phillips, 58, candidate for tax collector and treasurer on the Republican ticket in Modoc County, died at 8:40 a.m. at the family home, Sunday, May 30. He had not been ill previous to his death.

Mr. Phillips complained of feeling tired as he rose from bed and died before medical help arrived.

He was a veteran of World War I and homesteaded here in 1932. His filing for public office was his first venture into politics.

He was a past commander of Tulelake Post No. 164, American Legion, had served as finance officer and helped with the financing of the present Legion building. This year he was also serving as chef de guerre of the Klamath Falls Vulture, 40 and 8.

Surviving are his widow, Mrs. Kay Phillips, Tulelake, his mother, Mrs. Amy Phillips, Seattle and four sisters, Mrs. Rachel Phillips, and Mrs. Katherine Stanley, Seattle, Mrs. Clara Meek, Akron, Ohio, and Mrs. Gladys De Jarnette, Los Angeles.

Funeral services will be announced by O'Hair's Memorial Chapel.

Topping the list of things to be sold will be a 20x100 foot frame building, ideal for a garage and storage room. This building is suitable for moving.

Materials include about 700 feet of six inch iron pipe; six oil heating stoves, six hot water boilers, a John Deere grain loader, several lengths of small water pipe and fittings, such as L's, T's, valves, sprinkler heads, couplers and other items.

This material will all be sold to the highest bidder, according to Cliff Jenkins, manager of the Tulelake Growers Association.
