

Health Department Reports Firing 238 Security Risks

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Department of Health, Education and Welfare says that by April 30 it had fired or otherwise eliminated 238 security risks, including 114 suspected subversives.

The total, reported to Congress in testimony released today, superseded the Civil Service Commission's report last March that the department had uncovered 78 security risks.

The department also told a House Appropriations subcommittee that, in one 78-case category, about 40 per cent of those eliminated as security risks had been hired under the Eisenhower administration. The remainder, it said, were holdovers from Democratic administrations.

No breakdown was provided, in this case, between suspected subversives and those removed for other causes. A security risk may be a person who drinks or gambles too much or is found to be unstable mentally.

A number of Democrats in Congress have protested that many such persons left government service voluntarily without knowing they were classified as security risks.

Secretary Hobby testified that the government's newest department, with about 1,000 "sensitive" jobs, has set up a special 35-employee office of internal security to screen the staff. She requested \$285,000 for this office, as part of

a proposed \$1,600,342,000 budget for the department during the year beginning July 1.

In a formal memorandum to the subcommittee, the department said 10 "terminations" had been made in cases where the individuals' "files contained information indicating in various degrees subversive activities, subversive associations or membership in subversive organizations."

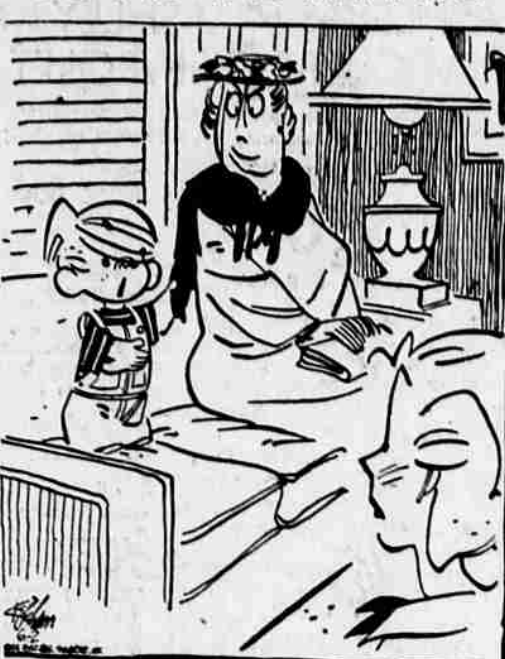
For the same reasons, 13 were suspended; 37 resigned under investigation when their files were known to contain unfavorable information; 53 more were "separated" in other ways under the same circumstances; and one was separated while unfavorable reports of subversion were being investigated.

The 124 nonsubversive security risks resigned under investigation or were separated on charges ranging from immorality to untrustworthiness, the department said.

Under Secretary Nelson A. Rockefeller testified that 147 security risks were uncovered between May and December 1953, and action has been taken in 91 cases since then.

Activities of the department range from handling the social security program to maintaining some institutions for the handicapped.

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Navy Changes Recruit Policy

After months of long waiting lists, the Navy is once again accepting young men for immediate enlistment it was announced today by Don Graham, local Navy Recruiter.

During the past year men desiring to enlist in the Navy had to wait their turn, in some cases for as long as six months. Now, however, applicants may set their own enlistment date.

Men who can qualify for the Navy are sent to Portland, Oregon for enlistment and are then flown direct to San Diego, California for training.

Recruit training lasts for a period of eleven weeks and upon the completion of training a two weeks leave is granted to the new blue-jacket so that he may come home to visit with his family and friends. After his recruit leave he may expect to be assigned to a Navy school or to a ship of the fleet.

Segregation Law Poses Problems

ST. PETERSBURG, Fla. (AP) — This city is getting out of the golfing business. City Council decided to do this after a long study of a petition from Negroes for use of the course.

Council action yesterday to terminate the lease on Pasadena golf course and turn the 18-hole course back to its private owners was unanimous.

In April a group of Negroes sought permission to play on the course. A special committee was named to study the petition.

Last week the committee heard predictions from its members and city officials that white players would stop using the course if it were opened to Negroes.

The committee meeting was after the U. S. Supreme Court ordered the city of Houston, Tex., to open its municipal golf courses to Negroes on a segregated basis.

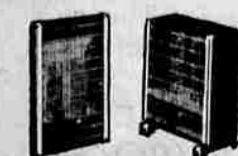

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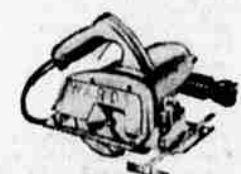
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
