Monsoons Stall Indochina War

HANOI Indochina — Heavy monsoon rains lashed northwest Indochina today, bogging down the feverish movements of Communist-led Vietnamese troops and convoys from fallen Dien Bien Phu towards the Red River delta.

The heavy rainstorms also forced French warplanes to discontinue for the second day running their plastering of the rebel forces on the march.

The most advanced Vietnamese elements from the fortress still were around 50 miles from the westernmost perimeter of the French delta defenses.

French army sources said a major Vietnamese assault on the delta still might come before the end of June. But they still thought the rains might force the rebels to defer attacking until the monsoons end in September.

The French high command reported another "calm day" in the delta.

Bombers heavily hit Vietnamese concentrations in company strength 12 miles south of Hanoi.

Fighters dropped delayed action bombs around the post of Chomoi, near Hanoi, 30 miles southeast of Hanoi. Attacked by the Vietnamese four nights running, the post had a quiet period last night.

A severday suspension was meted to George Baumgardner and Arthur Coleman, proprietors of Round-up Tavern, 2532 S. Sixth Street, for allowing a visibly intoxicated person to enter and remain on the licensed premises.

Suspensions were order by the commission at its meeting last week, following earlier hearings in Klamath Falls.

Among the hymns of old India which record Hindu folklore is one that was inscribed between 4,000 and 5,000 years ago. It praises the cow as one of the greatest benefactors of the human race.

Naturally, (take it from me), I won't argue.

But really, isn't it amazing how many dishes require milk. And milk in the dishes we send along your way provides you all the nourishment in that form as in beverage form. So naturally, the more you use, the better health your family will have.

Here's the dairy dish for this week, creamy baked custard: Take 4 or 6 eggs, 1/2 cup sugar, 1/2 teaspoon salt, one quart milk (scalded), one teaspoon vanilla, and a dash of nutmeg.

Use four eggs for making individual custards and six eggs for large custard. Beat eggs slightly, add sugar and salt and mix well. Add scalded milk gradually, stirring constantly. Flavor with vanilla and sprinkle with nutmeg, if desired.

Butter six to eight custard cups or 1 1/2 quart baking dish and pour in custard mixture. Place in shallow pan of warm water and bake in moderate oven, 350 degrees, 25 to 40 minutes for individual custards or 60 to 65 minutes for large custard.

A knife inserted in the center will come out clean when custards are done. This should serve six, but chances are the demands will be so great, three could do the job.

Suggested luncheon: Beefburger, radishes, green onions, dill pickles, creamy baked custard . . . and milk. Take it from me, you'll love it, Bessy.
