Former POW's Honor Chaplain

PILSEN, Kan. (AP)—The Rev. Emil J. Kapoun, heroic Catholic chaplain who died in a wretched North Korean prison camp, was honored in his hometown church yesterday by his fellow prisoners of war.

A crucifix exquisitely carved by prisoners from a piece of oak firewood with a makeshift knife in the prison camp was presented to the St. John Church in this town where Father Kapoun preached his first sermon.

Capt. Ralph Nardella, Paterson, N.J., presented a check for \$8,300 from fellow prisoners of the chaplain.

Nardella told how the camp's inmates vowed to contribute a fund in Father Kapoun's honor after he died of dysentery and pneumonia May 6, 1951, at the age of 35.

U. S. Sen. Guy Gillette (D-Iowa) is unopposed as is Rep. Tom Martin, the Republican challenger who will run against Gillette in November.

Among the remaining seven of Iowa's solid Republican eight-member congressional delegation, only Representative H. R. Gross of the 3rd District has competition. He is opposed by State Sen. Her-

man Lord of Muscatine and State Rep. Fred Schwengel of Davenport.

Clyde E. Herring, son of the late U. S. Sen. Clyde L. Herring, is the unopposed Democratic nominee for governor. Young Herring is Polk County attorney in Des Moines.

State Atty. Gen. Leo A. Hoegh (pronounced Hoy) an appointee of Gov. William S. Beardsley, who

is retiring from politics, appears to be the front-runner in the Republican gubernatorial race. A prime question is whether any of the six candidates will get the required 35 per cent of the total vote which nomination requires. Otherwise the choice will be up to the GOP State Convention in July.

Hoegh's opponents are Ben Ellsworth, Ottumwa attorney; A. B. Chambers, Des Moines auto dealer

and former mayor; William S. Lynes, speaker of the Iowa House; W. H. Nicholas, Mason City turkey grower and former lieutenant governor, and State Rep. Ernest Palmer Jr., Fort Madison attorney.

Carson Names Campaign Aide

Joseph K. Carson, Democratic Nominee for Governor, has named Henry L. Hess, prominent eastern Oregonian and Multnomah County lawyer, as General Chairman of the Carson for Governor Committee.

Hess, long prominent in state and national affairs is a graduate of the University of Oregon law school. After serving in World War I he engaged in the lumber business and was associated with Judge R. J. Green in law practice in La Grande for 18 years.

He was state senator for Walla Walla and Union Counties and served in the 1933 and 1935 sessions including the special session. In 1938 he defeated Governor Charles Martin for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination but was defeated by Charles A. Sprague in the general election.

In 1946 he was appointed United States District Attorney for Oregon and served in that capacity until 1954. Hess indicated he will resume his law practice in Multnomah County where he now resides.

US Ambassador Backs India

WASHINGTON (AP)—America's ambassador to India, George V. Allen, said today that country might undertake a defense alliance with its neighbors provided it felt Asians were taking the lead.

Allen, former envoy in such diplomatic hot spots as Iran and Yugoslavia, stressed India's strong feeling of nationalism time and again in a copyrighted interview in the weekly magazine U. S. News and World Report.

After reciting India's refusal to allow U. S. planes to fly over the country with French troops for Indochina, Indian opposition to U. S. military aid to Pakistan and other matters in dispute between India and America, Allen said he is nonetheless certain India would fight for its own independence and "my guess is they would fight for independent neighbors such as Burma as well."

He said chances for India's taking part in an Asian defense system "would depend somewhat on how it came about."

"If they felt the Oriental powers themselves were leading, and we were merely backstopping nonaggression with our power and resources," he said, "I think that might happen."
