Planting Units Used To Spread Game Fish

To accomplish the tremendous job of releasing the annual production of trout and salmon which is in the neighborhood of 500,000 pounds, the Oregon State Game Commission now has 20 individual planting units in operation. These range from small portable tanks of 150-gallon capacity to the large permanently mounted units of 800-gallon capacity.
The small units are used at several hatcheries where releases are made within a relatively short distance of the station. The large units operate on a state-wide basis frequently making round-trip runs of several hundred miles.
The game commission is experimenting with several different types of water aeration and circulation equipment in an endeavor to determine which is the most satisfactory in releasing fish from the Leaburg hatchery on the McKenzie River.
The fleet will be increased later with the addition of two 800-gallon tanks that will be used exclusively in releasing fish from the Leaburg hatchery on the McKenzie River.
It all adds up to the fact that it takes a whole lot of rolling stock to carry out the state-wide planting program necessary to meet present day angling demands.


