"DEEP IN THE GARDEN OF HER HEART, she found a flower . . . that grew apart, a flower sweet with friendship's dew and shared its fragrance first with you . . ."

Sarah "Sadie" Rachel Smith, daughter of Richard and Eliza Beamer, Winston-Salem, North Carolina, tobacco plantation owners, won her "spurs" at gardening when she was born into a family that loved the soil. She probably owes her "green thumb" to her Holland Dutch and Emerald Isle ancestry.

Her earliest recollections are of the green shoots that sprouted from the earth, warmed by a southern sun, of the vast tobacco barns that sheltered the season's crop . . . she early knew the satisfaction of the harvest and today she loves the toil of "dirt gardening," at her lovely hilltop home, 1525 Eldorado where a "joint" of pinks will take root if Sadie Smith touches it with her magic fingers.

In her early youth she was transplanted to a wheat farm in Eastern Oregon, near Milton-Freewater . . . it was there she "hit the floor at 4 a.m." to blend flour and shortening for biscuits that "begged" for the prune butter she made . . . where she fried fresh eggs and churned golden Jersey cream, where she kneaded dough for loaves of crusty bread and put countless peaches into crystal jars to feed the hungry gleaners of the grain.

In 1938 a homestead in Tulelake challenged. There, once more she "put down her roots," and made the desert blossom. A multiplying plant is a signal to "pass it on" and many is the garden across the California line that grows blossoms, shared by Sadie Beamer Smith. "Sharing" is a part of friendship, and Mrs. Smith knows by heart the origin of "starts" from gardens, here and yon, that flourish in HER Eldorado garden.

She lived cheerfully in a tent while the wild winds blew across the desert . . . she gathered rocks and hunted wave-tossed bits of driftwood that all true gardeners cherish, until one day the fertile land was "home."

She "chases care" and drives away the gremlins, with a shovel and a trowel . . . remembers while she works that just across the way are a daughter, Mrs. Martin Adams and two "grand kinder", Sharon Kay and Dennis Michael, who love to snuggle noses in Grandmother's prize peonies.

Down at the Herald and News, there is a husband, who watches type and helps check reporter's errors, who hastens home, come end of day, to nod approving head above a "hen and chickens," . . . who dotes on fishing and rarely lets a Mallard duck get by . . . George Smith, who'll never stray too far afield with "apple strudel" cooling on the hearthstone.

Actress Defends Methods Used In Raising Daughter

 HOLLYWOOD (AP)—What is the truth about Portland Mason, the fabulous 5-year-old?
 Many fantastic things have been printed about the daughter of James and Pamela Mason, the British filmstars. Among them: that she has her own mink coat and her own psychoanalyst; that her parents bought a school for her; that they take her to cocktail parties and night clubs.
 "To check up on such reports I went to the youngster's mother, dark-haired, intellectual Pamela Mason."

Mrs. Mason defended her daughter from the critics' barbs. "I wouldn't answer these things," she began, "except that Portland is beginning public school this fall. It is a terrible burden for her to face the other children after all these stories about her."
 "The only unusual thing about her upbringing is her hours. I was the oldest of six children and we were all brought up with tuition. We were required to be in the drawing room at a certain hour each day, and so forth. I missed being with my mother, and I vowed that I would rear my own child."

"Unlike many Beverly Hills children, Portland has no nurse. I take care of her myself. Rather than get up at 6 in the morning with her, I arranged it so she got up at 9 and stayed up later in the evening. That's all there is to it."
 About buying the school: "Portland went to a nursery school early and liked the teacher. She had to go out of business and we tried another school, but Portland wasn't happy. So we bought some prop-

erty for her former teacher to re-open her school, we are the mortgage holders, that's all."
 The cocktail parties: "The only one she attended was Kirk Douglas' introducing his new wife. We went because Portland is in love with Kirk. She was roundly criticized for being there, and we certainly wouldn't have gone if we had known it would be one of those big, all-star occasions."
 "When she was a baby, we used to take her to dinner parties at the Walter Wangers or other close friends. That was because I was nursing her."
 The night clubs: "Portland went to Ciro's once. That was because her dancing teacher was one of the Katherine Dunham troupe, and we wanted her to see the show. We came in when the first show started and left immediately after."
 The mink coat: "Utterly fantastic. If she has one, we haven't seen it."
 The psychoanalyst: "I don't believe I've ever met one in my life, and I don't think Portland has."

Dulles Warns Of Red Threat

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Secretary of State John Foster Dulles says there is a danger that Communist China may try to capture "free world positions in the western Pacific with a view to driving the United States back to California."

Without specifying which positions he had in mind, he warned the Red Chinese to keep "hands off."

Addressing the San Francisco World Affairs Council in a brief stopover last night in a whirlwind West Coast tour, he said if Red aggression occurs in the western Pacific the United States will consider it a "direct threat."

"We would hope with the help of the U.N., deal with it," he added, however, that even without the help of its allies, the United States would consider such Communist advances "a direct challenge."

"Our action would not depend upon others but . . . upon what was vital to the security of the United States," he said.

He also said any attempt to extend "European" political systems to South America would be considered a danger to the United States.
