

Rain Halts Guard Training

FORT LEWIS, W. A. downpour of rain interrupted regular training schedules of Oregon and Washington National Guardsmen of the 4th Infantry Division Tuesday and they moved indoors to continue their two-week summer encampment.

Training in weapons and individual tactics will take up much of the first week, with troops spending considerable time on the firing ranges. Some units will drill in combat tactics such as bayonet attack and infiltration of enemy positions.

Most units of the Division will take to the field overnight next Tuesday to fight a paper command war with a mythical aggressor.

A record postwar attendance of 7,300 guardsmen is reported at this year's encampment, the Division's seventh since World War II. This year the recruit training

program, which has been highly successful in two previous years, enlisted 900 men. They have been formed into a battalion to receive one week of special training.

The traditional Governors' Day review, Saturday June 19, will honor the governors of Oregon and Washington, with the 41st marching in review for distinguished guests and many visitors from home.

Gov. Patterson of Oregon and a representative of Gov. Langlie of Washington will review the troops under the combined command of the two states.
