Wetbacks To Be Sent Home

EL CENTRO, Calif. (AP)—Law enforcement agencies moved in mass against the wetbacks today, carrying out Atty. Gen. Brown's order to send home Mexican nationals who are in this country illegally.

Three of the drive's leaders said advance publicity had rendered Operation Wetback a premature success. They said most of the wetbacks apparently had taken the hint and scurried across the line.

They based this view on the fact that officers were having some difficulty rounding up the aliens, and at the same time they expressed some concern over the voluntary exodus.

One of the three leaders, Herman R. Landon, district immigration director at Los Angeles, said he feared those who departed ahead of the drive may be hiding out across the border, waiting for an opportunity to hop back into the United States.

He said he felt easier about those who are officially escorted out, since they are sent into the interior of Mexico.

London; Marcus T. Neely, district immigration director at El Paso, Tex., and Harlan B. Carter, chief of the U.S. border patrol, told a news conference yesterday of the government's plans for the drive.

Carter said the border patrol force, in California and Arizona, would total about 750, or 500 more than the normal total. He said a mobile striking force has been set up in addition to the patrols along the border in the two states.

This task force, said Carter, emphasizes speed and mobility, making use of jeep-aircraft teams, roadblocks on roads leading north and other techniques.

The three officials said that previous efforts in the last five days have rounded up 9,380 wetbacks, mostly transients, in California and Arizona. Of these, 5,222 were sent by bus to Nogales from El Centro.

Russians Lead In Chess Play

NEW YORK (AP)—A team of Russian chess masters, the odds in its favor, romped to a 5-1 lead early today in the first round of a match with America's top players.

The Russians, playing on U.S. soil for the first time, won four of their games and drew two in an encounter that lasted well past midnight.

Two matches, being played by Americans Donald and Robert Byrne, were not finished when the time limit of five hours ran out. They will be completed today.

The top American player, Samuel Reshevsky, played to a draw with the No. 1 Russian, Vassily Smyslov, and another young American, Arthur Bisguier, duplicated that feat against Tigran Petrosyan. The teams scored half a point for each draw.

One American chess official said in a speech of welcome that the Russian team represents the "greatest segregation of chess masters ever seen in the history of the world."

A crowd of more than 1,000 jammed the grand ballroom of the Hotel Roosevelt for the match. Russian and American flags hung side by side against the green backdrop. Both sides traded speeches, with the emphasis on possible future cooperation between the two nations.

Each player will play the same opponent four times. The second round will be played Saturday night.

Chicago Water Program Backed

CHICAGO (AP)—Fluoridation of Chicago's public water supplies was approved by the City Council Wednesday.

The program probably won't start until next year because there is no money for it in the current year's appropriations.

The annual bill for the first five years of the program is estimated at \$618,000. After that, engineers say, the yearly cost will drop to \$100,000 or \$200,000.

The Chicago Health Department supported fluoridation as a measure to combat tooth decay.
