The appraised value of the timber according to long-term normal market and operating conditions is \$13.85 per M. board feet for live and marked dead ponderosa pine, \$1.25 per M board feet for live and marked dead White Fir, \$1.25 per M board feet for live and marked dead Lodgepole pine, and \$1.00 per M board feet for unmarked dead timber of all species. No bid will be considered which is less than these rates as a base rate applicable through the entire period of the sale agreement, plus an additional amount of at least \$9.85 per M board feet for live and marked dead Ponderosa pine, \$0.50 per M board feet for live and marked dead White Fir, \$0.50 per M board feet for live and marked dead Lodgepole pine, and \$0.50 per M board feet for unmarked dead timber of all species, which additional amounts for all species except unmarked dead timber shall be subject to quarterly calendar adjustment upward or downward by 0.5 of the difference between the base index prices determined as set forth below and the average of the Western Pine Association index prices as calculated by the Forest Service at the end of each quarter. Such adjustment in the additional amounts for stumpage shall be applicable to timber cut and scaled during the calendar quarter for which the adjustment is computed. In no event, however, will the adjusted stumpage rates for each quarter be less than the basic appraised rate as first stated above. The base index prices for this sale are an average of the monthly Western Pine Association lumber price indices from January 1 to March 31, 1954. High bid will be determined by multiplying the total amount bid for each species that is to apply to all the timber cut prior to June 1, 1957, by the volume of that species, as stated below, which must be cut before redetermined rates below those bid can become effective. total rates will be redetermined, but in no event will the redetermined stumpage rates be less than the basic appraised value as first above stated, and in no event will redetermined rates which are below those bid, and adjusted as provided for by the quarterly adjustment provision in the agreement, become effective for a particular species until the quantity of that species scaled and paid for equals or exceeds the following amounts: live and marked dead Ponderosa pine, 32,000,000 board feet; live and marked dead White Fir, 4,400,000 board feet; live and marked dead Lodgepole pine, 400,000 board feet. In addition to the price bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$9.85 per M board feet, to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.50 per M board feet, to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing, and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over for the total cut of live and marked dead sawtimber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Lakeview, Oregon, prior to 2:00 p.m., Pacific Standard Time, July 19, 1954. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. \$50,000.00 must accompany each bid to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved.
