

### Judge Throws Out Riot Case

A disorderly conduct case which was held in abeyance due to a defense demurrer was thrown out of court Thursday afternoon by District Judge D. E. Van Vactor.

Defense Attorney George Proctor challenged the validity of the complaint against Dewitt Armstrong, 44, accused of beating his wife, on grounds that it alleged two crimes. Proctor also attacked an allegation of "riotous conduct" in the complaint, holding that under state law, three or more persons are required to constitute a riot. Judge Van Vactor upheld Deputy District Attorney Robert Kerr on the "riot" issue. Kerr said "riotous conduct" merely described the nature of the defendant's actions and did not accuse him of staging a riot. On the other point, the court ruled that it is illegal to charge two crimes in the same complaint. The complaint alleged disorderly conduct and assault and battery. Judge Van Vactor said the defendant could have been charged with both offenses in separate complaints. After dismissing the complaint, the court ordered \$50 bail posted by the defendant refunded.

### Washington State Deficit Reported

OLYMPIA (AP)—Washington state spent two million dollars more than it took in the last 14 months, increasing the basic general fund's indebtedness to \$45,646,839, a new compilation disclosed Friday. The compilation, prepared by Budget Director Ernest Brabrook, showed the state took in \$260,298,599 in taxes and from other sources since the biennium started April 1, 1953. Expenditures, however, totaled \$262,296,598. Social security, including medical care of needy persons, took 43 per cent of the total spent. Another 31 per cent went for the support of common schools.

### Reds Denounce U.N. Patrol

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—Russia denounced Thailand's idea of a U. N. peace patrol in Indochina Friday, foreshadowing the use of its 59th veto to kill U. N. Security Council action on it. Soviet Delegate Semyon K. Tzarapkin charged the idea, favored by at least 100 members of the 11-nation security council, was "a diversion and camouflage by the United States to widen the conflict in Indochina." A Russian veto would pave the way for Thailand to take the proposal to the 60-nation U. N. General Assembly, where Russia has no veto. Thailand's Deputy Delegate Thanat Khoman said Friday Thailand would push its proposal. Diplomatic sources said there would be a slowdown while delegations consulted and got instructions from their governments. They said a special assembly meeting was not likely before late July. The United States backed the Thailand proposal for a three-to-five member peace observation subcommittee to go to Thailand to check any Communist spillover from Indochina that would threaten Thailand. Thailand also wants the commission to operate in Laos and Cambodia, which with Viet Nam make up the Associated States of Indochina.
