Sale of Timber, Klamath Indian Reservation. Sealed bids, in duplicate, on forms provided therefor, marked outside "Bid, Edna Butler, A. I. O. U. M. #111 and addressed to the Superintendent, Klamath Indian Agency, Klamath Agency, Oregon, will be received until 2:00 o'clock p.m., Pacific Standard Time, on June 28, 1964, for the purchase of all merchantable timber estimated to be 22,800 feet B.M. Ponderosa Pine, more or less, which estimate is not guaranteed, on a tract within the Klamath Indian Reservation, described as the NE 1/4, SW 1/4, and N 1/2 SE 1/4 SW 1/4, W 1/2, Section 6, Twp. 36S., R. 8E., W. M. Each bid must state the price per thousand feet B.M. Scribner Decimal C Log Scale that will be paid for the timber cut. No bid will be considered for less than \$20.00 per thousand feet B.M. for Ponderosa Pine, and \$5.75 per thousand feet B.M. for other species which will not enter into the determination of value bid. A certified check on a solvent bank made payable to the Special Disbursing Agent in the amount of twenty per cent of the estimated value of the timber at the bid price must accompany each bid. The deposit will be returned to unsuccessful bidders. The deposit of the successful bidder will be held in lieu of bond pending satisfactory completion of the terms of the contract or retained as liquidated damages if the bidder shall not execute the contract within 30 days from acceptance of his bid. An additional deposit in the amount of twenty per cent of the estimated value of the timber at the bid price for timber to be cut will be required before cutting operations begin and in any case not later than 30 days from the date of approval of the contract. The right to waive technical defects and reject any and all bids is reserved. The contract will specify that all designated timber will be cut and removed on or before December 31, 1964, and that all other requirements of the contract, including slash disposal will be complied with by the same date. The contractor will be required to deck logs in advance of scaling or conduct logging operations in such a manner as will permit all timber to be scaled in as few scaling assignments as possible.
