Election Rule Announced

SALEM (AP) — A county clerk may have to pay the costs of an election out of his own pocket if he fails to collect enough in advance from the group sponsoring an election, Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton ruled Tuesday.

Thornton's opinion was given in connection with a case brought by Josephine County officials after a recent rural fire protection district election had cost more than the required \$30 deposit made by the sponsors.

The ruling said "... if the county clerk does not pay for the (election) services when they are rendered from the funds made available to him by the petitioner, he may be personally liable for the debt created since he can point to no statutory authority for lending the credit of the county by entering into such an obligation on behalf of the county."

Thornton suggested county clerks require a sufficient deposit from petitioners to assure coverage of election costs. He did not rule on whether or not the newly formed fire district would be permitted to reimburse the county clerk for election costs.

Voting Light In Primary

PORTLAND, Me. (AP) — Light voting was reported on the hottest day of the year Monday in Maine's primary in which Sen. Margaret Chase Smith battled a man she claimed Sen. McCarthy (R-W) apparently planted in the race against her. The mercury hit 83 here at 10 a.m.

Mrs. Smith and her youthful rival campaigned through election eve, with the senator contending that Jones apparently is McCarthy's candidate.
