Woods Lore To Be Taught

Conservation and camping go hand in hand. As in the past, game commission personnel will again assist camp directors in bringing to the youth of Oregon memorable camping experiences and a greater appreciation for Oregon's wildlife and the outdoors. Wildlife conservation and general woods lore will be taught by commission agents in over 125 youth camps sessions during the coming summer. Included in the sessions are Boy Scout, Girl Scout, Y.M.C.A., Camp Fire Girls, 4-H, denominational, and other organizational camps.

Mounted birds, study skins, antlers of deer and elk, pelts of furbearers and predator animals, and other wildlife specimens will be carried by each agent, and discussions concerning Oregon's wildlife will be held at each camp. In addition, agents will conduct group hikes, identifying plants and animals encountered and discussing the interrelationships of soil, water, plant life, and wildlife. Assistance will also be given in other camp activities.

From its inception by Austin F. Hamer, education agent, the game commission's summer youth program mushroomed from 25 sessions and a one-man crew in 1930 to over 100 sessions and a four-man team in 1953. Requests for the 1954 camping season far exceeded that of any other year necessitating the addition of a fifth man in order to fulfill the program. In addition to Mr. Hamer, commission personnel who will conduct programs are Mill Guyman, information representative, and conservation aides Rog Vorderstrasse, Bob Vincent, and Jim Bales.
