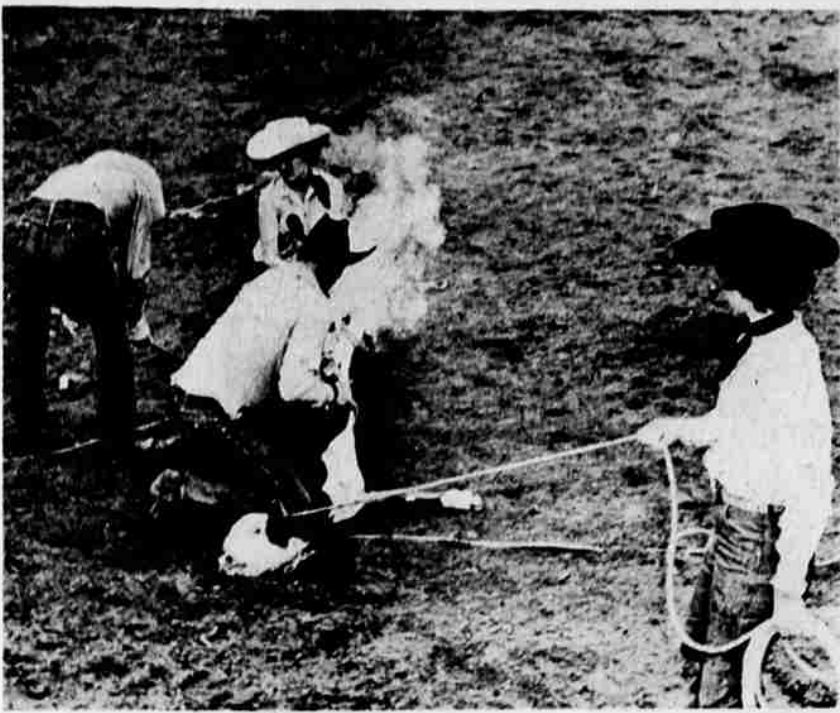

Today's Women

Fedora Bontempi, who teaches thousands of women to understand the art of good cooking via TV and radio, is a petite blonde who looks as if she would be baffled by the problems of boiling an egg.

Fedora and her singer husband Pino co-star in one radio and three television programs weekly, with a new TV show in the offing. Fedora cooks and Pino sings, and between them they manage to convey a sense of good living.

Fedora talks of cooking with affection. "Gee, your food as you cook, give it the benefit of imagination and interest, and it will turn out loving you."

She has been cooking ever since she can remember. Though her mother sometimes chased her out of the kitchen, she managed to acquire the fine Italian touch with pasta and sauces by the time she could read. Immediately after graduation from New York's Hunter College she went to Europe to study the finer points of French and Italian cuisine.

All this deep enthusiasm for cooking was entirely personal until she married Pino in 1938, a year after his arrival in this country from Italy. She was doing movie bit parts in New York at the time, and Pino was giving concerts and singing on radio.

Fedora decided they might as well pool their talents, and wrote a script involving the daily adventures, culinary and romantic, of an Italian singer and his wife. The Bontempis were an instant success.

Fedora still writes all the scripts for both radio and television shows. She and Pino produce a weekly television program, have two weekly radio programs, and a show from New York, playing up Italian cooking.

Their projected new program will deal with American cookery. Writing all the scripts, acting in all the shows, co-producing and cooking up new recipes keeps Fedora fairly busy, but she's a glutton for punishment.

"After cooking all day on TV, I start right in again when I come home," she says. "Pino still likes my cooking."

These statistics are gathered through a cooperative study being carried on by the game and fish commissions. Also, it was found that there were a record number of anglers seeking the chinooks, the time spent totaling 104,457 angler-days.

With the information being gathered in this project, the trend of chinook salmon populations in the Willamette River can be determined and management practices placed into effect that will benefit the fishery.

Salmon Catch Figures Shown

Angler-catch of spring salmon in the Willamette River in the Portland area this year fell below the catch for 1953. Records show that approximately 11,500 fish were taken this year, as compared to the record catch of 19,000 "Kings" last year.

Fisheries biologists for the game and fish commissions had anticipated this, since the parent run of fish in 1949 was one of the smaller runs in recent years. The escapement of fish past the anglers and on up the river in 1949 was calculated to be slightly over 9,000 fish. This year's escapement increased by a scant 800.
