Judge Orders Man To Work

An itinerant sign painter who officials say begged his way through 25 states with his 24-year-old wife and an infant daughter, was held in the county jail Wednesday while welfare officials attempted to find him a job.

The defendant, Raymond Ellaha Phillips, 44, frankly admitted to District Judge D. E. Van Vactor that he had an aversion to work. The judge deferred sentencing him on a charge of vagrancy until Friday.

"What's the longest you ever held a job?" the judge asked Phillips. "Six and a half years — that's while I was in the army," the defendant replied.

According to state police, Phillips and his wife and child arrived in Klamath Falls a few days ago from California. A Great Northern train crew collected nine dollars for them.

Phillips said he traveled throughout the country soliciting help from welfare agencies. His wife and child were placed under the care of the Klamath County Welfare Department.

"Whether you like it or not, you are going to work while you are around here," Judge Van Vactor told the defendant. "I'm going to delay sentencing you so that a job may be found for you. In the meantime, you must stay in the county jail."

Non-Support Case Heard

Dewey Rex Morelock, 25, went on trial Wednesday before a jury in Circuit Judge David H. Vandenberg's court on a charge of non-support of minor child.

The defendant's wife, Evelyn Morelock, had just taken the witness chair and answered a few preliminary questions put to her by District Attorney Frank Alderson, when Defense Attorney George Proctor moved for dismissal of the indictment.

Judge Vandenberg excused the jury while he heard arguments by opposing counsel.

Proctor contends there is no allegation in the indictment that Morelock committed a crime in Klamath County and, therefore, the court has no jurisdiction in the case.

Morelock was extradited from Oklahoma City. He is alleged to have deserted his 3-year-old son, Dewey Morelock Jr., last March.
