

Paul Andrews KO's Nardico

CHICAGO (U) — Confident Paul Andrews, a rangy ex-paratrooper with a stiff punch in either hand, Thursday drew a bead on an Aug. 4 bout with spookier Jimmy Nardico after enhancing his lightweight ranking here Wednesday night.

Andrews scored a fourth-round technical knockout over rugged Nardico at the Chicago Stadium. The 24-year-old Andrews, ranked sixth as a 175 pounder, dropped Nardico for a nine count in the third round and the Tampa, Fla., slugger was waved off as he tried to start the fourth.

Spokane Players Sian With Other Ball Clubs

SPOKANE (U) — Sixteen players left without jobs when the Spokane Indians suspended operations this week are looking on with other Western International League baseball clubs, manager Don Osburn said Wednesday.

Osburn said Larry Cummings, a free agent who joined the club on its last road trip, is the only player not yet signed. He said teams acquiring other players will announce their choices.

The Spokane team dropped out of the league Monday after failure of a drive to raise funds to keep the club in business the remainder of the season.

Osburn said he will clean up the Indians' business here, then take a job in the Philadelphia Phillies farm organization.

Manager Ben Getaghy of the Jacksonville Braves of the Class A South Atlantic League formerly was an infielder with the Brooklyn Dodgers.

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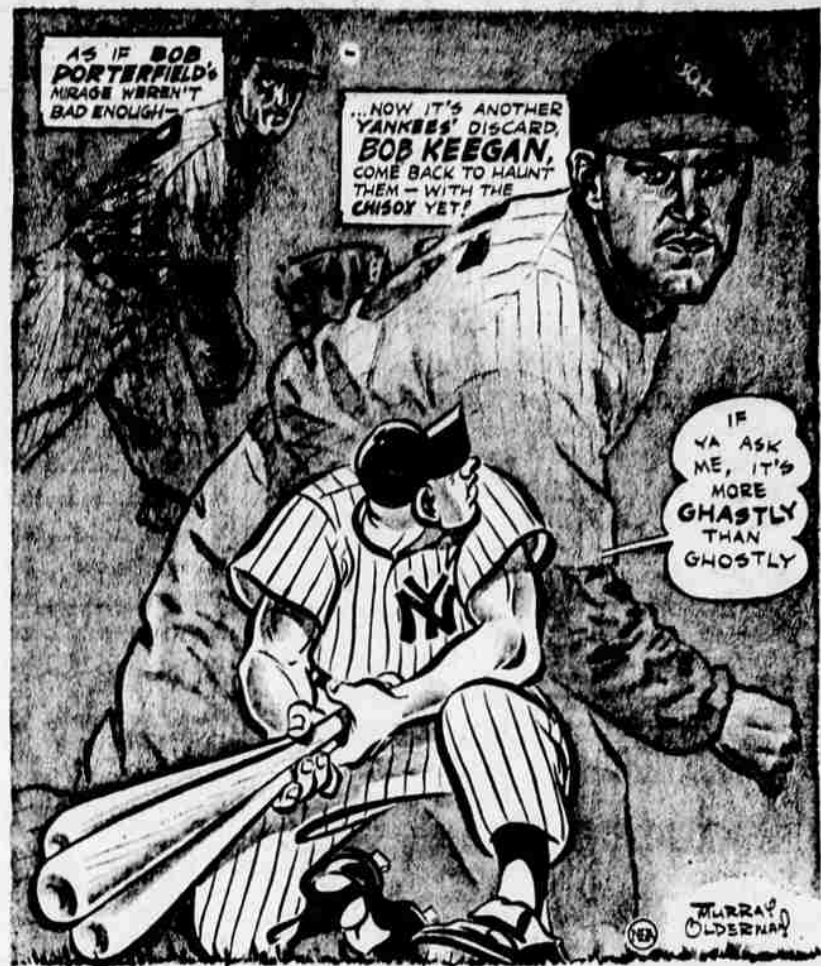

Haddix Far From Unhappy

PITTSBURGH (U) — Harvey Haddix, St. Louis Cardinal southpaw who's leading the majors with 12 victories, said today he isn't disappointed because he lost his bid for a fourth consecutive shutout by an eyelash.

"I just want to win 'em all," Haddix explained after his sparkling 7-1 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates last night. "No, I'm not disappointed. I didn't get another shutout. We won, didn't we? That's what all the Cardinals want, just to win."

Haddix allowed only five hits to the last place Pirates as he hurled his 10th consecutive victory. It was a particularly pleasing win for Haddix because his last defeat, his third of the season, was by the Pirates April 29. On that occasion the lowly Bucca nipped the Cards 4-3.

Haddix was rolling along in fine style last night, having given up only two hits until Dick Cole came up in the sixth. The Buc infielder fouled off a pitch then sent a drive to rightfield that went for a triple. A moment later he scored on an infield out to mark the 37th consecutive shutout.

With Cole's hit went Haddix' chances of beating the record of 46-1-3 consecutive scoreless innings set by Carl Hubbell, ex-New York Giant pitcher. And the bingle kept Haddix from trying to tie the National League record of four consecutive shutouts held by several pitchers.

"I wasn't worried about that hit," Haddix said after the game. "After all, we had a 5-0 lead and my job is to win ball games, not to concentrate on shutouts. Of course, I don't like any runs scored against me — no pitcher does."

Haddix has beaten every team in the league. Pittsburgh has been his victim three times and he's won two pieces from Cincinnati, Milwaukee and Philadelphia. Chicago, Brooklyn and New York each have lost once to him.

In the individual action, Marshall Brown had high series and Don Miller rolled the high single game. Their scores were 628 and 577.

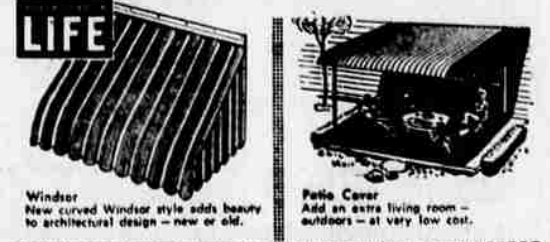

Notice is hereby given that the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, has called a special election, which will be held the 23rd day of July, 1954, at which all registered voters residing within the bounds of the territory hereinafter described are invited to vote on the proposition of annexing said territory to said City and extending the boundaries of said City to include same. The polling place for said election has been fixed at the Nimitz Street, in said territory. (This location was used as a polling place for Canal Precinct of Klamath County, Oregon, in its last election.) The polls for said election will be opened at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon and shall remain open until 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon thereof, during which time the registered voters residing in said territory may cast their ballot for or against the annexation of said territory to said City.

The ballot title for said election is as follows, to-wit: Shall the boundaries of the City of Klamath Falls, Oregon, be changed by adding thereto certain territory and area adjacent and contiguous to said City, described as follows: Beginning at the center line of Washington way and the north line of Eberlein Avenue, extended in Township 38, South, Range 9 E.W.M., Klamath County, Oregon; thence south along the center line of Eberlein Avenue, 39 South, Range 9 E.W.M.; thence east in the section line, common to said Township 38 South, Range 9 E.W.M., being the center line of Sunnyside Addition, extended in Klamath County, Oregon; thence north on the east line of said Sunnyside Addition to the northeast corner of lot 6 in block 2 of said Sunnyside Addition; thence west on the north line of said Sunnyside Addition to the east line of Tract 37 in Enterprise Tracts of Klamath County, Oregon; thence north on the east line of said Tract 37 to its intersection with the north line of Eberlein Avenue; thence west on the north line of Eberlein Avenue to the point of beginning, containing 68.8 acres more or less.
