Cordon Shows GOP Record

WASHINGTON—The record of the Republican administration in the field of rural electrification is superior to that of the last Democratic administration, Senator Guy Cordon said today. Commenting on criticism of the new administration in the field of rural electrification, Oregon's senior senator said: "Republicans have always been and are today strong supporters of rural electrification. "Looking at the record itself, during the present Republican administration, the Rural Electrification Administration made 349 loans, totalling \$181,118,100 in the 12-month period from May, 1953, when Republican Ancher Nelson was appointed by President Eisenhower to head REA. "Contrast this with the preceding year under the Truman administration. From May, 1952, through April, 1953, the REA made 315 loans which added up to \$157,612,091. The first year of Republican administration of REA saw an increase in the number of loans by 24 over the peak year of Democratic administration—rural electrification loans, and these 34 loans amounted to about \$25,000,000." Senator Cordon made two other points. He said that: 1. Contrary to Democratic charges, Nelson has recommended with the approval of President Eisenhower retention of the 2 per cent interest rate on REA loans. 2. The Republican 80th Congress, in which Senator Cordon was a key Senate member, established a record in the field of rural electrification which has been surpassed by no Democratic Congress. The 80th Congress provided \$80,000,000 to extend rural electrification to nearly 1,000,000 farm homes. This sum was nearly twice as much as any previous Congress provided, and only \$275,000,000 less than the grand total provided for REA in the whole period prior to the 9th Congress.

Judge Rules On Indictment

A defective indictment brought freedom to Dewey Rex Morelock, 35-year-old construction worker, whose trial for non-support of a minor child, was halted Wednesday afternoon. Defense Attorney George Proctor moved for dismissal of the indictment on grounds it did not specify where the alleged crime was committed. Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg held that as the indictment did not state that the crime occurred in Klamath County, this court had no jurisdiction in the case. He made his ruling after hearing arguments by Proctor and District Attorney Frank Alderson. Morelock was arrested on the non-support charge in Oklahoma City. His wife, Evelyn, was the complaining witness.
