DeMolay Honor To Be Given

Two members of the Klamath Falls chapter Order of DeMolay, will receive the Chevalier degree this month. This is the highest national award of merit given to members over 18 years of age.

Receiving their degrees on Saturday, June 26, will be Marvin Nerseth, son of Dr. and Mrs. Marvin Nerseth, 2027 DelMoro, and Clayton Hanson, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Pawver, 5030 South Sixth. They received official word of the award by letter from Frank S. Land, Kansas City, secretary general of DeMolay.

Selection is made from applications submitted by local chapter advisers to the national meeting of the Grand Council Order of DeMolay. This year's meeting was held earlier in the year at Dallas, Texas.

This is the first time this award has come to this chapter since it was presented to Jim Owens in 1946.

Nerseth was state senior counselor for the 1952-53 term and was chairman of the state convales in 1951-52. He is studying medicine at Stanford University and will enter his junior year this fall.

Hanson was vice chairman of the state convales in 1951-52. Both are past master counselors of the Klamath Falls chapter of DeMolay and both have been active members for the last six years. Hanson attended the University of Oregon for the first term of 1953-54 and is now sports editor of the Herald and News.

The public is invited to open ceremonies to be held at 8 p.m., Saturday, June 26, at the Masonic Hall. Installing officers will be Bill Milne, Chuck Friedel, Charles Carlson, Guido Robustelli and Chuck Bonney, who are members or past members of the advisory council.
