

# Florists-All-Star Tickets Go On Sale

Ticket sales for the Ery Lind Florists-Klamath Falls Women's All-Star game will start tomorrow at Underwood Camera Shop for those who want to buy their reserved seats before the game time July 9.

The 20-30 Club and the city recreation department has been moving bleachers to Conger Field and there are plans to have close to 1,000 reserved seats, and the remaining stands will be for general admission prices the night of the game.

The Florists, from Portland, are known as the New York Yankees of women's softball, being that they have won the world championship twice and have been in the national playoffs several other times.

They are probably the best drawing card for any type of softball or baseball team in the Northwest, and Klamath Falls was very fortunate to get the team to stop over for the game with an all-star delegation, according to a 20-30 Club spokesman.

Betty Evans Grayson and Thekla Parrish Carlson will lead the Florists against the local star-studded team along with six other All-American women softballers. Grayson has been named to seven All-American teams and Carlson was chosen to the national outfield twice. Included on the team are two All-American catchers, Betty Wadsworth and Lois Williams. Wadsworth was named once and Williams six times.

The local team under the coaching of Bob Mathis and Ray Arnold will make its final selection of the all-star team tomorrow night after the All-Star-Dumour ball game on Conger Field starting at 6:00.

## Managers Have Two View Points

CLEVELAND (AP) — To Casey Stengel, it's "that big series in Cleveland." Al Lopez calls it "a crucial weekend, but certainly not one of those do-or-die times."

No matter how they described it, in separate interviews with newsmen, there was little doubt that Managers Stengel of the Yankees and Lopez of the Indians view with respect the three-game series their teams open here tonight.

"Sure, the Indians are tough," conceded Stengel whose men have a 4-1 record against Cleveland this year. "But we're playing well enough."

Here, Stengel referred to New York's current won-lost percentage of .627, right now behind Cleveland's .692, but good enough to win the pennant for the last five years.

Manager Lopez, however, had a ready answer for that sort of speculation.

"I don't care what percentage New York had the last five years. It doesn't matter, so long as ours is bigger."

Separated by four games, the first place Indians and the third place Yankees plan to send their best pitchers to the mound in the series. For New York, it will be Allie Reynolds, Ed Lopat and Whitey Ford. For Cleveland, Mike Garcia, Early Wynn and Bob Lemon are scheduled.

Garcia and Reynolds, facing each other in tonight's opener, each has a seven game winning streak.

Good fishing weather finally hit the Klamath Basin last weekend, and it has continued so far this week with the forecast for better fishing tomorrow and Sunday.

Last weekend, some of the streams were beginning to produce a little better after the heavy rains and cold weather that hit the area a few weeks back, and this weekend should see a further improvement in the angler's luck.

Probably the biggest news of the Basin streams is that fly fishing has made a big jump over the past two weeks, and the anglers who fish the streams and lake edges with flies should again do all right for themselves.

Spring Creek, at Collier State Park, picked up a little bit last week from what it has been, both on bait and fly fishing. Either the Nymph or the Yellow Forked Tail seemed to have the answer to last week's fishing in the park's streams.

The Williamson River also produced some nice size fish and a few limits over the past week of angling, according to all reports that we received.

**GOOD RESULTS**  
Bait, spin, fly or trolling, any of the four, proved out with good results last Saturday and Sunday on the upper Basin stream. The Bagdore brothers, Walt and Bill, again hit the Williamson with very good luck last weekend. They were using Flash Bait Spinners.

Another good catch of Mackinaw was reported by Marion Grant, at the local laundry man hooked into and landed two nice size Mackinaws from the waters of Odell Lake. He, like Bill Frenzel and Vern Johnson two weeks ago, was using a U-20 flat fish when he caught the trophies.

Elmer (Buster) Bramlett and a couple of his fishing companions struck it rich last Sunday as they hooked their limits from Union Creek. This weekend's angling on the creek should again be good, from all the indications.

East Lake, Paulina, and Crain Prairie, in the Bend area, should all be good again this week, as they have been in the past. Probably the best bet of the three would be the trip into East or Paulina. Either trolling with medium size

spinners or still fishing with bright medium colored eggs seems to be the best possible chance for a limit catch.

Fish Lake and Lake of the Woods were again fairly good to some anglers, with the Jackson County waters of Fish being the best.

Single eggs on a small hook and light leader brought the best results at Fish, while trolling with Ford Penders and worms supplied the right bait at Lake of the Woods.

Streams in the Bly and Lakeview area also were fair to good last week, with some nice catches being bagged at both the Bycan and the Chewaucan Rivers. The Sprague River was spotty with some catches taken in some areas.

Trolling in the Upper Lake is still fairly slow with some results being made with Ford Penders and worms. Daredevil, Flat Fish and Andy Reekers. Rocky Point seems to be the best fishing in the Lake at this time of the year, and should be fair again this weekend.

**RAPID CHANGE**  
With the rapid change in the weather, from the cold winds to the hot sunshine, Crappie in Gerber Reservoir have taken to flies and a few jures a lot better than they were, and several very large catches were made Saturday and Sunday, and a few others earlier in the week.

In Poole's Big Fish Contest, David Robinson, on Bonanza, won last week's prize with his seven pound 12 ounce rainbow that he hooked in Lost River. John Mozingo had the second place fish with a seven pound 2 ounce rainbow that took worms on the Williamson.

So far this week, P. C. Cahon's seven pound seven ounce trout is the largest one in the contest. Cahon caught his while fishing along Eagle Ridge.

Two arrests were made during the past week for game violations by the State Police, one for exceeding daily bag limit and the other for fishing prohibited methods.

Game officers arrested an angler on the Bycan River for exceeding the limit as he had 12 rainbow and the limit is 10, as long as five of them are under 12 inches.

The other arrest was made at Four Mile Lake for chumming. The defendant was caught throwing single eggs and chumming eggs over the side of the boat four times by the arresting officers.

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# San Diego Gaining Ground On League Leading Stars

Lefty O'Doul's San Diego Padres, helped a little by Seattle and a lot by San Francisco, are gaining ground on Hollywood in the Pacific Coast League baseball race.

The Padres dumped San Francisco Thursday night, 4-3, for their third straight win over the slipping Seals. The win plus the Hollywood-Seattle split doubleheader at Seattle boosted the Padres to within 4½ games of the Stars.

Artie Schallock, who is beginning to look like the top lefthander in the league, notched his eighth victory since coming to Oakland from the New York Yankees. He beat Portland, 3-1, holding the Beavers to six hits and not being scored upon until the ninth. Jeronimo Heard was the loser.

Ray Orteig's home run with two men on base proved to be the big blow in Seattle's 5-3 first game win over Hollywood. Lino Donoso, the Stars' Cuban lefty, was the victim. Orteig also hit a double and drove in all five Rainer runs. Bob Hall, whose option was returned to Pittsburgh by Hollywood recently and who was immediately sold by the Pirates to Seattle, was the winning pitcher although relieved in the seventh and final inning.

Hollywood had to go 10 innings to take the nightcap, 6-4. Seattle grabbed a three-run lead in the second but the Stars scored four in the sixth. Monty Baagall's triple accounting for two of them. Steve Nagy, the starting pitcher was relieved by Vern Kindsfater during the rally.

Doubles by Al Zarilla and Joe Erazut tied the count in the Rainer half of the sixth, but Hollywood won in the 10th on singles by Baagall and Lee Walls, a wild pitch and two sacrifices. Donoso, coming back for a relief chore after Jim Walsh started, was the winner. Van Fletcher relieved Kindsfater in the seventh and was charged with the loss.
