These opening lines of a poignant poem-written by Mary Boyd Wagner, Klamath's own poet of national fame, reveal how close she is to the richness of living.

Although Mary Boyd Wagner, born where minerals pit the deep brown hills about the town, Yreka, raised in the friendliness of Klamath Falls, acclaimed across the wide expanse of our America, has been in print, somewhere in this country most of the time since she first put pen to paper, she has just had published her first book of verse... "Roots"...

Containing nearly 100 poems that cover many human experiences... "To read this book, according to a famous reviewer, Grace F. Collins, is an emotional experience. To own it is to have at hand, a heart-warming, pulse-quickening feast where you may feed on the substance of a dream."

Some poems come with ease she says and some "come hard"... she has seen in print the thoughts that bring to life the humble things that men and women do, the glowing experiences, the laughter and the love that flows about her.

Mary Boyd Wagner was born the daughter of Dr. E. J. and Frances E. Boyd, Klamath pioneers. Time stepped in and gave her California for a "birthland" while her mother visited away from home. She grew up in Klamath Falls, graduated from Klamath County High School and early in life began to clothe her thoughts with words that sing.

She was wooed and won beside local streams and lakes... married into the hustle and bustle of newspaper life... shared her talent with the multitudes... became a member of the Poetry Society of America, vice president of the American Poetry League, currently national chairman of the branch publication, of the National League of American Penwomen, the most powerful literary association around the world.

She is a lover of animals, stray kittens at her door are never turned away... she landscapes with vim, is helping restore a lovely old home in New York State where flowers are her hobby and real dirt gardening is more than a whim.

She is the sister of Mrs. Guy Hancock and Dr. W. R. Boyd of Klamath Falls, mother of a daughter, grandmother of a sturdy little boy.

Ten thousand years of marching time-of scorching heat and withering frost, Ten thousand years, and still they climb... and still her magic is the same... How few can capture in a few brief lines the majesty of living?

## Mt. Shasta To Offer Courses

Two two-week courses will be offered in the city park building at Mt. Shasta, California by Chico State College during the summer of 1954. Each course will carry two units of residence credit and each satisfies a part of the requirements for the regular elementary credential.

Francis "Frank" Burke, assistant superintendent of Placer County schools will instruct the course Education 320, elementary school language arts from July 26-August 8. Students who have credit in Education 320 may enroll under Education 324, the English language arts. Burke has had a major responsibility in producing the language arts course of study by the northern section, California School Supervisors Association. As a former administrator and supervisor in Siskiyou County, he is quite familiar with the problems faced by teachers in Northern California.

Dr. Charles Mills of the Chico State Division of Education and Psychology will instruct the course, Education 151, elementary school social studies from August 9 to August 29.

Classes will meet three hours daily, all meetings being held prior to noon. All enrollees will be required to purchase a textbook which will be made available at the time of registration.

Registration in both courses will be held at 8:00 a.m. on the opening day so that a full three-hour class meeting can be held that same day and still close at noon. Students may not enroll for credit after the beginning of the second day of the workshop.

The old "your slip's showing" remarks aren't worth the breath expended any more. More color leaving the American scene.

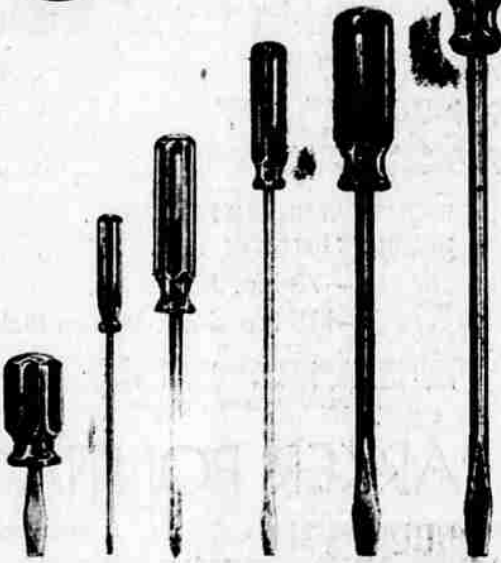

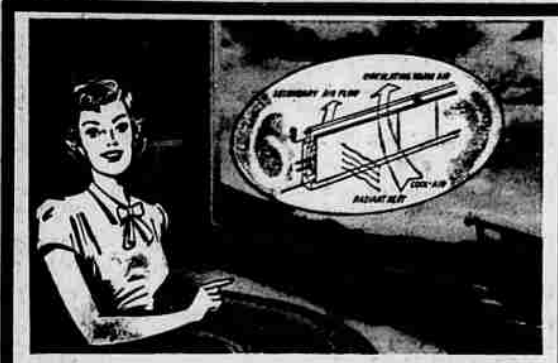
