## Civil Defense Test Fizzles

BREMERTON (AP) — A scheduled mass evacuation of this Navy yard city fizzled slightly Thursday as less than half its 35,000 residents took part.

Civil defense officials, conceding that public participation was "very poor," said, however, that it was not a cause for gloom. They pointed to the smooth evacuation of the 18,000 persons who did participate, the complete absence of any accidents and the generally orderly flow of traffic from the city into five loop highways leading away from the city.

The evacuation started officially at 4:30 p. m., when sirens were sounded to herald the approach of an imaginary enemy with an imaginary atomic bomb. Unofficially, however, hundreds of cars had started wheeling out of the city a half hour or more in advance of the sirens. So many left early, in fact, that observers said traffic was heavier in advance of the test than during it.

## FHA Officials Face Charges

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Housing and Home Finance Agency announced Friday that two more long-time officials of the Federal Housing Administration have been suspended pending disposition of charges of "serious irregularities."

The announcement by Administrator Albert W. Cole gave no details of the allegations against the two men. They are: James E. Hicks of Washington, director of FHA's Region 2, and Andrew Frost of Albuquerque, assistant state director for New Mexico.

Cole said he based his request to FHA for the suspensions on information furnished by William F. McKenna, deputy administrator in charge of the current investigation into FHA operations.

## Dead Man's Letter Used For Defense

NEWARK, N.J. (AP) — A surprise after-death defense put ex-Gov. Harold G. Hoffman on record today as denying he did wrong as New Jersey employment security director even though he had embezzled \$300,000 from his own bank. "As far as I know, there has been nothing wrong in my state department," the late Republican governor said in a letter released last night by his daughter, Mrs. Ada Hoffman Leonard.

## Chukars In Maupin Area Show Gains

At least one group of the newly introduced chukar partridge in eastern Oregon appear to be making noticeable gains from 1 a 1 year.

Game agent Paul Ebert working on the Webb Ranch near Maupin found several instances of increase, and Mr. Webb and his caretaker Mr. Dietz added to the information on the chukars in this area.

Ebert located two pairs of chukars without young and another pair with 15 young approximately 3 weeks old.

Elsewhere in the Buck Hollow area, east of Maupin, Mr. Webb noticed one brood of 12 young and reports that his ranch is "saturated" with the newcomers. Also, Mr. Dietz spotted 57 young with 7 adults in one group. Again the young were approximately 3 weeks old.

One of the most unusual bits of information about the chukars also came from Mr. Webb. He mentioned observing two male birds fighting until they drew blood. So intent were they in their fighting, Webb finally had to get off his horse and bodily lift them off the trail to get past. As soon as they were off the trail, the chukars immediately returned to their fight.

This is unusual since literature on the birds mentions they are pugnacious in the spring, but there are few reports of actual combat. Even in the crowded conditions experienced in game farm raising of the birds when many are put in a pen together, there has been little intensive fighting noted.

Scattered reports from other areas also indicate that the chukars have successfully come through the winter. During May and June, 2,368 adult birds that were used for breeders earlier in the spring were released in eastern Oregon. These birds were all banded for later identification. Plans are to release a total of 10,000 birds this year and continue protecting them until a harvestable surplus exists.

## Dead Man's Letter Used For Defense

Meyner commented on Mrs. Leonard's news conference: "I have no desire to defame the memory of a dead man, but the public is entitled to the facts and will get them."

The 58-year-old Hoffman, governor from 1935 to 1938, was suspended March 18 and died before the state's charges were revealed. Meyner announced a 16-count report against him 10 days ago.

Hoffman's documents answered many of the charges, which he presumably learned about because of conferences between Meyner and Harry Green, who was acting as Hoffman's attorney.

One count said Hoffman entered into leases of property and construction of buildings without submitting contracts to the State House Commission or the director of purchase and property.

"There is nothing wrong, to the best of my knowledge, with the rental-purchase agreements entered into by the state," wrote Hoffman. "I believe that it represents sound business."

Moreover, Hoffman's letter said, when Meyner was a state senator and a practicing lawyer, he represented a group of people who wanted to construct division local office buildings.
