### Woman Wins Plane Ride

Mrs. Bruce Elliott, 5428 Independence, was the winner of the courtesy airplane ride Sunday given by Menti-Newton Corporation for having recruited the most new members into the Ground Observer Corps since the May monthly "Pop."

"Pop" Newton piloted the plane that flew Mrs. Elliott over the Klamath basin, parts of northern California and back by way of Lakeview, where they spotted a herd of Antelope below, furnishing the champion recruiter with an unexpected thrill.

To Gloria's credit are 20 new volunteers, 11 already having stood two hour watches per week in the observation tower, and who are now on the way to piloting up the 30 hours active duty needed to earn their wings, a silver medal pin, awarded by the United States Air Force. Three new types of awards have been added by the Air Force, in addition to the wings, and the merit certificate. The new awards are: certificate of appreciation, signed by the director of Civil Air Defense, for one new member; a silver medal certificate signed by the Commander Air Defense Command, for five new members; a gold certificate, for 10 new members, also signed by the Commander Air Defense Command. This offer began June 1 and will continue through December 1, according to Russell Avery, air port supervisor.

Two Orientation films were shown by Lt. Guon, U.S. Air Force. One, a color film called "Target Nevada" showed the Atomic bomb tests made in the Nevada desert about a year ago, and showed just how disastrous a single bombing could be. After the pictures were shown, Lt. Guon gave a short talk and stressed the need for many more Ground Observers who can spare a couple of hours per week in the observation tower as their part in this important part of the Civil Defense program.

Hosley is principal of Covington Junior High School at Los Altos, California, with an enrollment of 830 students in three upper grades.

He was born and raised in Klamath Falls. He was graduated from Klamath Union High School in 1940 and entered Oregon State College the same year. He was graduated in 1943 with an A.B. degree from San Jose State College and entered V-12 in the Navy, enrolling at Southeastern Missouri State College. During 1944 he studied at Columbia University in the Navy midshipman school and at North Carolina State College taking Navy diesel work.

During World War II he served as commanding officer on board a minesweeper in the South Pacific, returning to civilian life in 1945, and entering Stanford University in 1949. He received his masters degree in music education that year. His doctorate this year followed.

Hosley and his wife Virginia, also prominent in music circles, with their three children, Charlotte, 6, David, 4, and James, 1-year-old will arrive here in July for a month's vacation at his mother's home.

### Judge Hears Guilty Plea

Pleasant Ray Estell, 27-year-old laborer, who was nabbed in an alleged attempted burglary through a secreted infra-red camera at the Economy Wrecking Co., pleaded guilty to a charge of breaking a window not his own Friday.

After Estell, who was represented by Attorney William Ganohe Jr., admitted the charge, Circuit Judge David R. Vandenberg asked District Attorney Frank Alderson to outline the facts in the case.

The court deferred passing sentence until next Monday. The judge instructed Alderson to have Detective Adkins in court at that time.

County jail records show Estell served a prison term for burglary.
