Vet's Mailbag
Veterans administration received nearly 42,000 home loan applications for guaranty during May, an increase of 23 per cent over April and a 73 per cent increase over May, 1953, VA announced today.

VA said that the spurt in appraisal activity since last February is home loan applications.

Home loan applications for guaranty are submitted to VA by lenders on behalf of veterans.

The volume of appraisal requests to VA continued to spiral in May for the fourth straight month. During the month, VA received appraisal requests for 89,134 dwelling units, of which 52,245 were for proposed dwelling units and 36,889 were 22 per cent above the volume were for existing homes. The total in April and 90 per cent higher than the number of appraisal requests in May, 1953.

VA also reported that the terms on which lenders will grant loans to veterans are easing. A survey of VA guaranteed loans closed in May, 1954, shows that nearly 25 per cent of all GI home loans were made without a down payment.

The same survey disclosed that 61 per cent of the loans were written with 25 to 30 year terms.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK

A. No. Under the law, non-participating term insurance policies issued to Korean veterans may not be converted to permanent plans.

Plans For NW Gas Line Pushed
FORT WORTH, Tex. (AP) — C. R. Williams, president of Pacific Northwest Pipeline Co., said here Thursday night that his company is "not slowing down the least bit" in plans for constructing a pipeline to the Northwest.

He said the firm is going ahead as if the Westcoast Transmission Co., Inc., had made no gestures to question the Federal Power Commission's authorization of the contract.

"We think it's such a clear cut decision that we're going on with engineering, financing and contracting," Williams said. He added that he expected no delay from the FPC "on such a clear cut order as they wrote."

"We're betting our money there will be no delay," he said. Preliminary survey work, Williams emphasized, will begin in September as originally planned.

Trade Bill Extended For Year

WASHINGTON (AP) — Chairman Millikin (R-Colo.) of the tariff-writing Senate Finance Committee and Sen. George (D-Ga.), its senior Democrat, agreed today that Senate rejection of a liberalized reciprocal trade agreement plan throws the whole controversial question of a broadened foreign

trade policy over to the 1955 Congress. The Senate yesterday rejected, 48-32, a Democratic move for a three-year extension of the Reciprocal Trade Act with new powers to cut tariffs 15 per cent. Then it passed a straight one-year extension of the old law, 71-3.

On the key vote, six Democrats including George joined with the 39 Republicans present to defeat the Democratic-sponsored substitute. The "aye" votes were all from Democrats.

However, Millikin and George agreed in separate interviews today that the vote did not represent a true test on the recommendations of the Randall Commission on Foreign Economic Policy for some further reduction of tariff barriers.

President Eisenhower based his original foreign trade recommendations of Congress in March on the findings of the special commission headed by Clarence B. Randall, president of Inland Steel Co. Eisenhower called for the liberalized extension of reciprocal trade which the Democrats sponsored yesterday.

But later, in a letter made public in May, the President said he would go along with the one-year plan for the time being. This came after key House Republicans had balked on the broader proposal. Eisenhower said, however, he was not abandoning his program but was giving Congress an opportunity to study it further.

Millikin pledged there would be an exhaustive study of the Randall recommendations next year. George took a similar attitude, saying he would support many of the proposals of the Randall Commission but only after there had been full hearings on the question next session.

The one-year extension bill must go back to the House for consideration of two minor Senate amendments. There was a chance the House would accept them and send the measure directly to the White House.

Air Academy Site Named

WASHINGTON (AP) — The West Point of the Air, training school for the young men who will man America's air armada of the future, will be built near Colorado Springs, Colo.

Secretary of the Air Force Talbot announced his selection of that site late yesterday, ending years of bidding by rival sites which originally numbered in the hundreds but had been narrowed down to three by a special selection board.

Thus the Rocky Mountain country of the West gets the Air Force's counterpart of the two old service academies, both situated on the Atlantic seaboard: The Army's West Point, N. Y., and the Navy's Annapolis, Md.

Some 15,000 acres of rolling country which curves up to the wooded foothills of the Rocky Mountain chain dominated by 14,109-foot Pikes Peak will be the locale of the Air Force Academy, on which Congress has authorized the expenditure of 136 million dollars.

The eventual cost may be much higher. The academy is not expected to be ready for use before mid-1957. A temporary home will be established at Denver. Talbot's announcement did not say precisely where, but presumably it will be at Lowry Field, a big Air Force installation.
