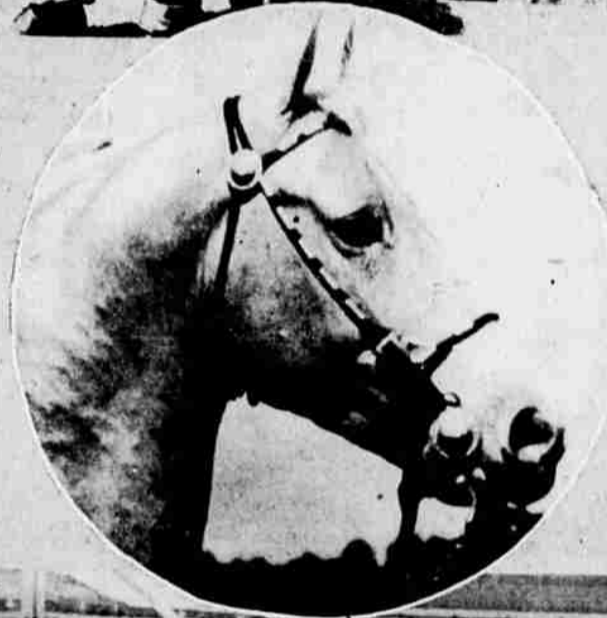


# Sunday Afternoon At the Moons'
