Red China, India Urge Free States

NEW DELHI, India (AP) — Prime Minister Nehru of India and Premier Chou En-Lai of Red China called jointly Monday for an Indo-Chinese political settlement creating free states "which should not be used for aggressive purposes or be subjected to foreign intervention."

will be achieved there soon. French Premier Pierre Mendes-France has promised his people one by July 30.

The communique was issued here and in Peking following three days of talks here between Chou and Nehru. The communique reiterated the same theme which was prominent throughout their meetings: That Asia and the world would achieve peace if all nations adopted principles of non-aggression, peaceful co-existence and other ideals expressed in the preamble of the recent India-China agreement on Tibet.

They said the states of Indochina — Viet Nam, Cambodia and Laos — should be "free, democratic and unified." This was viewed here as indicating Chou is ruling out any portion of Indochina.

The Prime Minister made clear Indochina was their key topic and their comment on Indochina appeared to be the lone new proposal in the area of world politics covered by their communique.

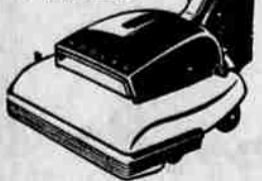

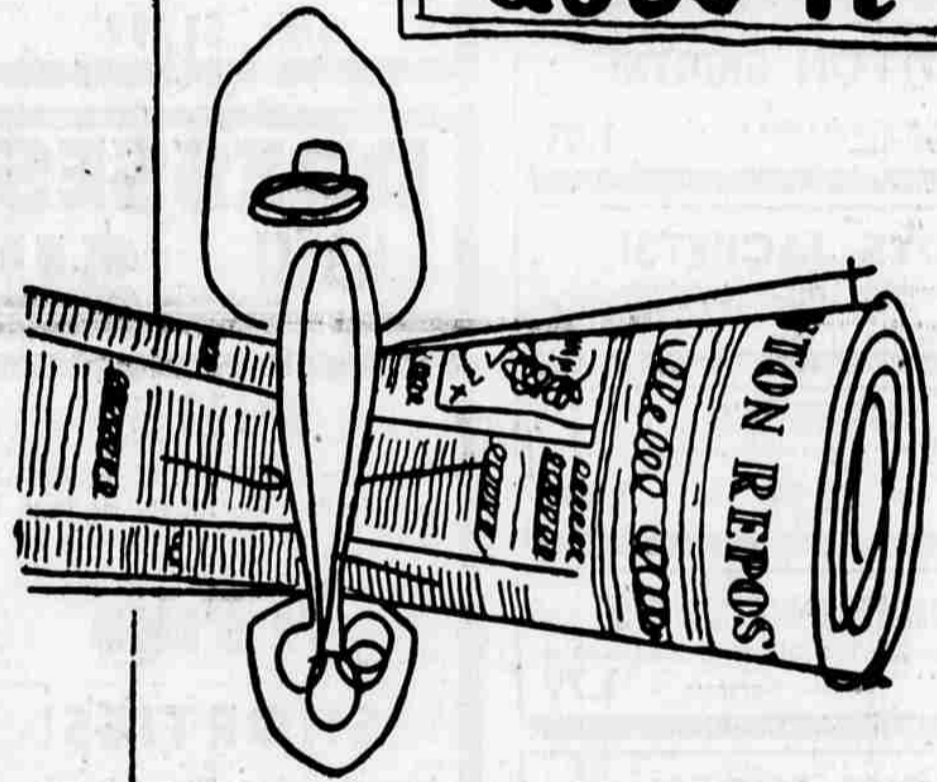
