

### Spud Hearing To Be Held

TULELAKE — August 3 is the date set for the hearing at Tulelake on the potato marketing order, according to word received Monday from W. J. Kuhl, chief of the bureau of markets for California. The hearing, scheduled to start at 9:30 a. m., will be held in the Marcha Theater.

Between now and the date of the hearing, Kuhl stated, his office will mail each interested potato buyer, shipper and grower a copy of the marketing order which will be presented at the hearing for final approval.

### Oregon Flower School Held

Twenty-eight flower enthusiasts from Tulelake, Bonanza, Ashland, Merrill, Malin and Klamath Falls garden clubs are enrolled in the Oregon State Flower Show School now in session.

The school opened Monday morning with instruction by Mrs. Orrin Hale, co-editor and publisher of "Pacific Gardens and Homes," the official organ of the Oregon State Federation of Garden Clubs published in Seattle.

Mrs. Hale emphasized the education value of flower shows and the duty of garden clubs to attempt to increase the beautification of the community.

In addition to her work as a journalist (she is a regular contributor to "Pacific Gardens and Homes" under the heading, "Aunt Emmy Says"), Mrs. Hale is a nationally known horticulturalist and is outstanding in her field of local instruction — rose and delphinium horticulture.

The afternoon instructor, R. e. Pennington, explained the elements of design and principles of art which are involved in flower arranging.

"Modern flower arrangements differ from the traditional with their distinctiveness, plan of design, color harmonies, good proportions, scale and application of the principles of art," the instructor said.

Miss Pennington, foremost colorist, consistently conducts classes in color and has taught in both Seattle and Portland.

Both instructors were on the agenda again today — Mrs. Hale instructing in the horticulture of fruits and vegetables; Miss Pennington on flower arrangement with concentration on the color aspect, emphasizing analogous harmonies. She illustrated her talks with several arrangements employing native rocks and flowers.

Wednesday written examinations will be taken by garden club members who are studying for a nationally accredited judgeship.

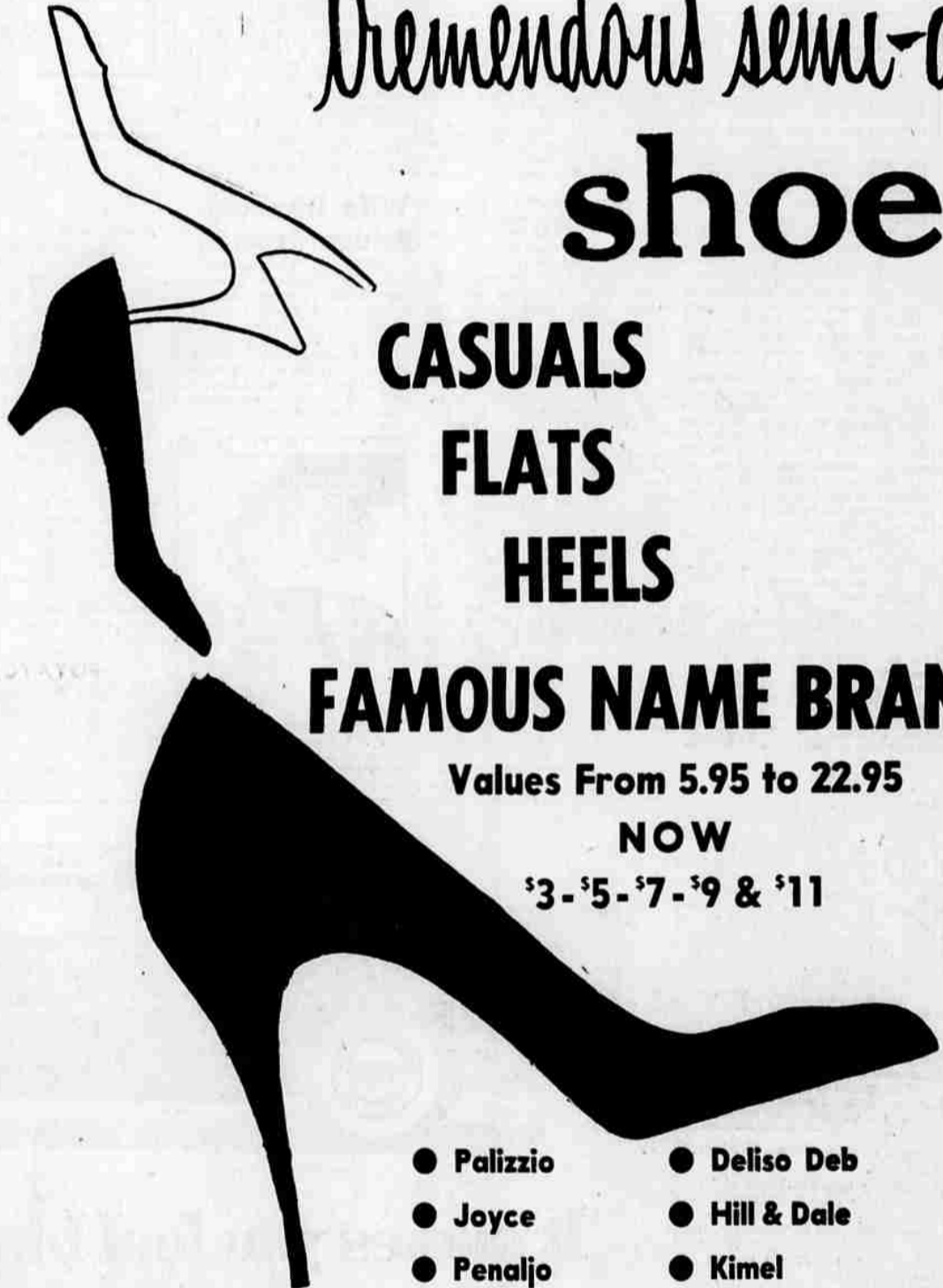

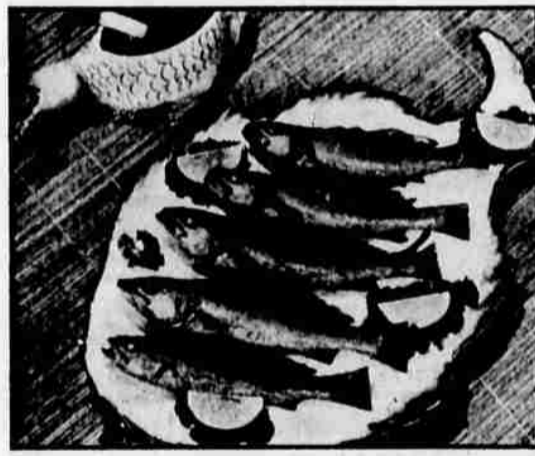
