### Three Killed In Accidents

Three persons met violent deaths in separate accidents in Oregon Tuesday.

One was fatally wounded by a gun shot, one was believed the victim of a hit-run driver, and another died in a fall.

Donald Lehman, Portland, told police a gun he was examining accidentally discharged and the bullet struck his wife in the head, killing her. She was Mrs. Patricia Ann Lehman, 19, who was three months pregnant. Lehman said he and his wife were getting ready for their vacation and he was examining a borrowed gun when the mishap occurred.

Peter Russell Griner, 4-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd O. Griner, was found dead beside the highway at his home near Philomath.

The boy's grandfather, William S. Newport, discovered the body. Cause of death was not immediately determined but police believed a hit-run driver was responsible.

Frank Mahn, 63, a resident of Twin Rocks, was killed when he fell from a scaffolding while nailing shakes to the side of his house.

### Adlai to Vacation At Oregon Ranch

PORTLAND (AP) — Adlai Stevenson, former governor of Illinois and 1952 Democratic presidential nominee, will vacation in Oregon next week.

Democratic party officials said Stevenson would arrive Saturday and spend a week in an undisclosed Oregon ranch.

On July 10 Stevenson will address a Democratic rally at Eugene.

### Red Leader Returns Home

HONG KONG (AP) — Premier Chou En-lai returned to Communist China today after attending the Geneva conference on Asia and meeting with top officials in India and Burma.

The Red leader's plane stopped for an hour at this British crown colony for refueling before flying on to Canton and Peiping.

Concluding their Rangoon talks, Chou and Burmese Premier U Nu issued a joint communique last night pledging to "strive their utmost for promotion of peace." They expressed hope, particularly, that peace can be restored satisfactorily in Indochina.

The communique also announced that Burmese-Chinese relations would be guided by the same principles agreed upon by Red China and India to cover their relations on Tibet and reiterated by Chou and Indian Prime Minister Nehru at the end of their weekend conference in New Delhi.

These, the communique said, are "mutual respect for each other's territorial integrity and sovereignty, nonaggression, noninterference in each other's internal affairs, equality and mutual benefit and peaceful co-existence."

Western observers have viewed Chou's visits to India and Burma as part of a campaign to draw south Asian neutrals into the Peiping orbit under the pretext of uniting against "colonialism."

### Driver Injured In Truck Crash

Considerable damage to two diesel transport trucks and injuries to one driver, occurred about 3:30 this morning in a rear-end collision near Algoma Highway 97.

FARM STRIKE — FERRARA, Italy (AP) — A costly strike of 100,000 farm hands that tied up Ferrara province for more than two months and brought 70,000 cattle to the edge of starvation was called off Wednesday. The Communist-controlled Chamber of Labor announced the suspension of the strike to aid negotiations now in progress in Rome.

### Nation's Heat Wave Lifts

Pleasant weather appeared the outlook in most of the country Wednesday as current heat waves in many areas were broken.

Thunderstorms rumbled across wide sections in the central part of the nation Tuesday night, with strong winds and heavy rains in many cities. The storms broke the stifling heat.

In the Southeast, cooling air from the Atlantic and from the Gulf brought at least temporary relief from the stifling hot weather.

The stormy weather extended over the central part of the country from southwestern Texas to the Canadian border and from the Rockies to the Great Lakes region. Early Wednesday a belt of thunder showers extended over West Central Illinois westward across Northern Missouri, Kansas and the eastern slope of the Rockies in Colorado. A smaller band of showers was reported in Southwestern Michigan and near Lake Erie in Northern Ohio.
