FBI Division Has Anniversary

WASHINGTON (AP) — The FBI's identification division will mark its 30th birthday Thursday with more than 131 million fingerprint cards in its files and additions at an average rate of 17,000 a day. The division was founded in 1924 with slightly more than 810,000 fingerprint cards turned over to it by the International Assn. of Chiefs of Police and the Leavenworth penitentiary bureau. FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover said the fingerprint files are divided into criminal and non-criminal sections, with the latter accounting for more than 80 per cent of the present collection. The files are in constant use, not only in criminal investigations, but in such other fields as identification of amnesia victims and victims of accidents or disasters, and in locating missing persons.
