Fiscal Year Ended June 30

WASHINGTON (AP) — This is fiscal New Year's Day for the government and it looks like Uncle Sam wound up the old year in the red by about the 3 1/4 billion dollars that had been predicted. However, the deficit for the fiscal year ended Wednesday may be a little smaller than previously estimated. Revenues evidently were lower than anticipated, but cuts in government spending went deeper than previously predicted.

The government begins its fiscal or business year on July 1 and closes its books annually on June 30. The year beginning Thursday is fiscal 1955, for which President Eisenhower has predicted a deficit next June 30 of about \$2,928,000,000.

In his budget message of last January giving revised estimates for the fiscal year just ended, Eisenhower predicted that fiscal 1954 spending would total about \$70,902,000,000 and net receipts would come to approximately \$67,974,000,000. That would leave a deficit of about \$2,928,000,000.

The treasury will not have final complete figures on the fiscal year until about July 19. However, from the way spending and receipts have

ficit may be about a quarter of a billion dollars less than the January estimate, or about 3 billion dollars instead of 3 1/4 billion dollars.

West Oregon Timber Sold

PORTLAND (AP) — The Georgia-Pacific Plywood Co. announced completion of a big timber deal which President Owen R. Cheatham priced at 12 million dollars.

Georgia-Pacific acquired a large timber stand in Western Oregon and to get it bought all the stock of three firms.

These were the Inman-Poulsen Lumber Co., Western Logging Co. and Saginaw Timber Co. Dant & Russell, Inc., was a large owner in Inman-Poulsen and in the big timber stand, known as the Grand Rapids tract.

Georgia-Pacific indicated the timber would be milled at the C. D. Johnson Lumber Corp. at Toledo, which is near the tract. The Johnson mill, one of the nation's largest, was purchased by Georgia-Pacific in 1951. Georgia-Pacific said the purchase price of that mill was \$15,500,000.

The Inman-Poulsen mill in Portland, which has employed 300 men, probably will be closed, Georgia-Pacific indicated.

One of the largest of plywood producers, Georgia-Pacific operates 14 plants in this country.

Solon Issues Ultimatum

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Knowland (R-Calif.) said Thursday if the Chinese Communists are admitted to the United Nations he will resign as majority leader of the Senate and devote my full efforts... to terminate United States membership in that organization.

Knowland told the Senate that there is likely to be "a Communist victory of no mean proportions" in Indochina and as a result of that he expects a concerted effort later this year to bring Red China into the U.N. through action by the General Assembly.

"On the day that Communist China is voted into membership in the United Nations I shall resign my majority leadership in the Senate so that without embarrassment to any of my colleagues or to the administration, I can devote my full efforts in the Senate and throughout the country to terminate United States membership in that organization and our financial support of it," Knowland declared.

"My conscience would not permit me to remain silent or inactive if this last grand appeasement takes place."
