Liquor Funds To Be Distributed

Coffers of cities, counties and the general fund of the state will be enriched \$2,804,805.49 during July, when available revenue from liquor and privilege tax receipts for the quarter ending June 30 will be distributed by the Oregon liquor control commission.

The general fund will receive \$2,020,000, and localities will share in the remaining \$309,805.49, which will be allocated according to population. Of the total distributed, \$2,500,000 comes from liquor sales revenue, and \$304,805.49 from privilege taxes levied on malt beverages and table wines.

New Shopping Center Rises

The mushrooming growth of the new Town and Country Shopping Center on South Sixth Street was increased with the pouring concrete foundations this week for two additional units.

The first building is nearing completion and will be occupied by the Roberts Hardware, which is moving to the new location this week from 127 South Sixth Street, by an electrical store, a sporting goods business and a jewelry concern.

Harry (Bob) Waggoner, owner of the new enterprise, announced today that demands for completed units are far exceeding space that will be immediately available. Requests will be met as rapidly as construction permits.

Information is being sought by owners of women's ready to wear shops, men's wear stores, paint businesses, restaurants, and for a supermarket, Waggoner stated.

As planned the suburban shopping center will accommodate from 35 to 50 separate business and service establishments. Waggoner expects to have 18 or 20 operating by late fall.

Buildings are of pumice tile with California design. Covered sidewalks will connect the units to minimize foot traffic hazards. Hundreds of feet of plate glass will line the fronts of the buildings.

Two streets, 70 feet wide, entering from South Sixth Street will bisect the property. There will be four exits to surrounding streets, one from each side of the 7.7 acre area.

Diagonal parking is specified with enough paved space in the center itself and adjacent proper-
