H. A. Jewett Dies Monday

A resident of Klamath Falls, prominent in business circles since 1923, H. A. "Jack" Jewett, died July 5 in Stanford Lane Hospital, San Francisco, where he had been a patient for the past three weeks.

Mr. Jewett was born in Dighton, Kansas, June 26, 1896. He came to Oregon when 15 years old settling in Pendleton. In 1923 he came to Klamath Falls, engaging in the automobile business and real estate. In 1925 he became associated with the Parks Grocery on South Sixth Street as manager. The grocery was later discontinued and Parks Variety Store opened.

Mr. Jewett had been suffering from a heart condition for many months.

He made his home with Mr. and Mrs. James W. Parks, 2640 Home-dale Road.

Surviving are his mother, Mrs. Emma Jewett and one brother, Oliver Jewett, both of Dighton, Kansas.

MOLALLA (AP) — Crowds estimated by officials as totaling 40,000 attended the annual three-day Molalla Buckaroo, which ended here Monday.

They said profits will be used for community playground and first aid programs.

In rodeo competition Harry Hart, Seattle, won the silver buckle award for being the all-around cowboy. Taking part in the four rodeo events were such nationally known cowboys as Ross Dollarhide, Lakeview, Ore., and Jim Shoulters, Henryetta, Okla.

Chinese Faces Theft Charge

NEW YORK (AP) — A Chinese businessman was arrested here Tuesday in connection with the alleged theft of \$810,000 in Chinese Nationalist funds intended for purchase of surplus war supplies.

The man, identified by Nationalist officials as Ku Chin Chang, 48, was said to have received the funds from former Nationalist Gen. Pang Tsu Mow, who fled to Mexico in 1951.

The general was accused of embezzling some six million in Nationalist funds while in charge of the Chinese republic's air force office in Washington, D.C.

Chang was arrested on a grand larceny charge at the request of Cha Chien Liang, Nationalist China's vice minister of justice.

The vice minister said Chang had received three checks from the general, one for \$210,000 and two for \$300,000 each.

Detectives who arrested Chang at the Hotel Wellington in Manhattan said he denied any wrongdoing, and as saying he thought the money given him by the general was his own.

Chang was quoted as saying the Nationalist government owed him more than one million dollars for property it had confiscated from him in China.

The Nationalist vice minister had handled the purchase of war surplus materials for the Nationalist forces.

French Given Huge U.S. Aid

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States has poured more than \$2,200,000,000 dollars in military and economic aid into Indochina over the past four years as part of a stepped-up program to defeat Communist armies.

An additional sum of more than one billion dollars is tentatively scheduled to bolster French and anti-Communist Indochinese armies in the year which began July 1—unless a truce ends the 7 1/2-year-old war.

The biggest share of American aid—about \$1,235,000,000 in arms and economic supplies—moved into Indochina in the last fiscal year after the Eisenhower administration decided to double American help in a determined effort to crush the Communist threat.

This increased flow of guns, planes and military equipment meant the United States was carrying 45 per cent of the bill for prosecuting the war in the 12-month period.

English Meat Prices Soar

LONDON (AP) — Housewives Tuesday began a battle against the high price of Britain's new "freedom" meat.

Butchers said a lot of housewives entered their stores but few bought anything—waiting for the price to drop.

Rationing ended at midnight Saturday and prices immediately went up. Prices were still up Tuesday with only a slight drop. One butcher said: "Within a day or so the whole situation will be back to normal. Customers are already talking about boycotting meat and living on fish and eggs."

Rump steak in heading had jumped from 43 cents last week to 70 cents a pound. Prime joints had jumped 14 cents.

MANILA (AP) — Gen. James A. Van Fleet, personal envoy of President Eisenhower, arrived Tuesday for a four-day fact-finding visit and was promised Philippines support in the fight against Communism.

Union Holds Memorial Service

PORTLAND (AP) — The 20th anniversary of what the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union calls "Bloody July 5" was observed Monday by Portland members.

They held a memorial service for union members killed in the historic 1934 West Coast waterfront strike. No longshoremen worked during the 24-hour observance.

The Very Rev. Thomas J. Tobin, vicar general of the Catholic archdiocese of Portland in Oregon, gave the invocation in the service at the Willamette River harbor wall.
