Claud Davis, the oldest furniture man in Klamath Falls, will become affiliated with the Klamath Furniture company, Sprout said.

It came swimming out the water pump on the Ryan ranch of Upper Klamath marsh. Tony Castel, prominent Fort Klamath resident, secured the little fish and vouchers for the tale that it actually came from a well.
