**Hotel Strike Postponed**

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (AP) - A last-minute postponement was announced today in a strike scheduled against the seven lavish hotel-casinos on the Las Vegas Strip.

Ernest J. Leupp, business agent for the AFL International Union of Operating Engineers, said the group had acceded to a request by the AFL Central Labor Council that the strike start this morning be put off until Friday.

Leupp said he hoped negotiations would continue. The Central Labor Council president, Ralph Leigon, said that if the 80 operating engineers strike, the 2,200 other AFL hotel employees will observe picket lines.

Leupp said present pay scales for the engineers average \$2.30 an hour, and the union is asking a 10 per cent boost plus a health and welfare program.

Roy Flippin, representing the luxury hotels, said this would mean an increase of 15 per cent and the hotels will shut down if picket lines are established. He said wages ranged from \$2.17½ to \$2.45 an hour.

NEW YORK (AP) - For 14-year-old Peter Devlin Smith there is no place like home, even if this home is in hot, muggy New York.

His parents, however, thought it would be a good idea if the boy spent the summer in Norway, where he goes to school.

"This idea Pete didn't like at all. And the tall, blond boy had made it quite clear."

"If you don't send the passage money to come home, I'll stow away," he warned in a letter. But his mother and stepfather, Nora and Kendall Smith, apparently had underestimated this grimly determined. Pete didn't get the money.

Yesterday, when they returned from a Fourth of July weekend trip, the telephone rang and the stepfather picked up the receiver.

"Hallo, Papa," he heard. "Papa, here I am."

It took some time for Papa to figure out what was going on. Finally an immigration official got on the phone and explained. Yes, Pete was here waiting to be picked up.

Later, at his Manhattan home, Pete explained everything.

He and 13-year-old Jon Eric Johansen decided to come over. So they walked aboard the Norwegian American Line flagship Oslofjord on the crew gangplank, and that was it.

## Treasure Hunt Ends In Death

SANTA SUSANA, Calif. (AP) - The daughter and non-in-law of a machinist killed yesterday in his search for buried treasure are convinced he was about to find it.

Mr. and Mrs. Jack Hooper of Los Angeles said they will continue the hunt.

Her father, Ronald Merton Fuller, died yesterday at the bottom of a 35-foot shaft, one of many he had dug searching for three chests of gold he believed a Mexican bandit had buried more than 75 years ago.

Fuller, 45, had searched in his spare time for eight years. He had read widely about the bandit, Tiburcio Vasquez, who was hanged in 1875. The chests he sought supposedly were taken from an ambushed stagecoach and buried under a huge rock shaped like a lizard's head.

Guarding the shaft in which Fuller lost his life was a huge rock shaped like a reptile's head. Recent entries in his treasure-hunting log indicate Fuller was convinced he was nearing his goal.

Apparently he met death when dynamite fumes caused him to fall from a ledge inside the shaft to the bottom. Two sailors working with him found the body.
