Air Force Tells Of Fast New Jet

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Air Force says a new daylight jet fighter — which reportedly has flown up to about 1,500 miles an hour — has passed flying tests at Edwards Air Force Base, Calif. Yesterday's cryptic announcement disclosed that the Lockheed XF104, an "air superiority" fighter, had made its first flight last February.

The Air Force gave out little specific information. However, other reliable sources have said the ship weighs only about half as much as jets now in the air, but is twice as fast as the swiftest of them.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The bill to restore the USS Constitution and dispose of the famed warships Constellation, Hartford, Olympia and Oregon, has gone back to the House for approval of a few minor changes made by the Senate.

The measure was passed Tuesday by the Senate and returned for approval of the changes. It provides for restoration and maintenance of the Constitution and turning over of the Constellation and Hartford to the cities of Baltimore and Mobile, Ala., respectively.

The Olympia and Oregon are to be kept one year. After that time, if no one bids for their care, they may be disposed of by the secretary of the Navy.

QUAKE — BERGEN, Norway (AP) — Residents of Norway's west coast were shaken early Wednesday by a moderate earthquake which rattled doors and windows in the area between Bergen and Stavanger. Two distinct shocks were felt. No casualties or damage has been reported.

Participants are requested to take their own picnic lunch and fishing equipment if they desire. Boats may be rented at the lake for fishing expeditions on the lake for Mackinaw, which are in abundance in the lake at a depth of 200 to 300 feet.
