# Retired Newsman Dies Wednesday

PORTLAND (AP) — Ernest P. Hopwood, 80, who retired in 1933 after 25 years as circulation manager for The Oregonian here, died in a Portland hospital Wednesday after a week's illness.

# Strike Fails To Close Atom Plant

OAK RIDGE, Tenn. (AP) — The nation's entire output of uranium-235, vital for atomic bombs, continued to be produced today by company workers at plants here and at Paducah, Ky., despite a strike by 4,500 CIO chemical workers.

The union posted picket lines early yesterday at the two plants after President Eisenhower had urged them to stay on the job until a fact-finding board could look into the wage dispute with Carbide and Carbon Chemicals Co., operator of the plants for the Atomic Energy Commission.

The union is demanding a 15-cent hourly wage increase for its 2,500 workers here and 1,000 more at Paducah. The company has offered a 6-cent hourly boost retroactive to April 15. Wages now range from \$1.58 to \$2.40 hourly.

As the orderly picketing continued last night, Jess Hamon, president of the rival AFL Atomic Trades and Labor Council, urged Eisenhower to name an impartial arbitration board.

The board be "binding upon both sides."

His council represents 4,500 workers in two other atomic plants here.

The CIO union has made no attempt to block workers from their jobs, and AFL workers, as well as thousands of construction workers, streamed across the picket lines today.
