Appointment of Miss Mary McConnell as Klamath County 4-H extension agent has been announced by F. L. Ballard, associate director of Oregon State College extension service. Her appointment is effective July 15.

Miss McConnell, who was graduated from OSU this year, is from Milton-Freewater. For seven

Indochina Peace Talks To Resume

GENEVA (AP) — Soviet Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov returned to the Indochina conference today. His arrival promised a step-up in the negotiations for a cease-fire in the war which for nearly eight years has ravaged the French territory in the Far East.

The Russian was the first of the major diplomats to return to the

parley which they left two and a half weeks ago after it settled down to negotiations between military representatives on details of a cease-fire.

Other key figures also were expected to return soon.

French Premier Pierre Mendès-France, who is acting as his country's foreign minister, announced in the National Assembly yesterday he would go to Geneva soon to take personal charge of the French delegation.

British Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden also is expected back in Geneva early next week, and Communist China's Premier-For- eign Minister Chou En-lai likewise is expected to come back from Peking.

Smith will return from the United States.

In the absence of the top diplomats, conference activity has been confined chiefly to negotiations between representatives of the rival military commands in Indochina.

The busiest of these is made up of French, Vietnamese and Viet-minh officers and is concerned with arrangements for regrouping of troops if a truce is arranged for Viet Nam, the chief battleground of the Indochina war.

Another commission for Laos, made up of French, Laotians and Vietminh, also has been meeting. The third military group, for Cambodia, held its first session yesterday and planned another meeting today.

All three commissions are scheduled to report their progress to the full nine-party conference Saturday.

Cardinal Issues Order

CHICAGO (AP) — Roman Catholics in the Archdiocese of Chicago, in a pastoral letter from Samuel Cardinal Stritch, have been forbidden to take part in meetings or assemblies by "men outside the church" who seek to establish Christian unity.

"The Catholic Church does not take part in these organizations or in their assemblies or conferences," said the cardinal, who is archbishop of Chicago. There are some 1,800,000 Roman Catholics in the Chicago archdiocese, one of the world's largest.

The cardinal's letter did not mention by name the World Council of Churches assembly in suburban Evanston Aug. 15-31. But Dr. William A. Visser 't Hooft, of Geneva, Switzerland, the council's general secretary, said in a statement he felt the cardinal's decision is "regrettable."

Dr. Visser 't Hooft, who is here making final arrangements for the meeting, said it had been hoped that Roman Catholics might attend the second assembly of Protestants as observers.

He expressed surprise that the pastoral letter did not refer to an official Vatican instruction of 1949, under which, he said, Roman Catholics have been observers at previous World Council sessions.

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
