

# Hollywood Increases Lead With Shutout Over Beavers

The Hollywood Stars have increased their Pacific Coast League lead over San Diego to 3 1/2 games. The Stars whipped Portland Tuesday night, 11-0, while Los Angeles downed San Diego, 5-2. Linozo Donoso, the slick Cuban southpaw who came to the Stars this year from the Mexican League, posted his 14th win against three losses. He now is the league's top hurler and he looks like a cinch to win rookie-of-the-year honors, barring injury to his throwing arm. He fanned eight Portland batters, scattered seven hits, and was in command of the situation all the way. It was his eighth shutout.

Portland, which had held some sort of jinx over the Stars all season, didn't get much in the way of pitching, as Hollywood slammed three hurlers for 16 hits, one a double and the rest singles. The Los Angeles victory lifted the Angels out of the PCL cellar, even if only by one percentage point. Portland slumped into last place.

Seattle and Oakland divided a doubleheader, the Oaks taking the opener, 2-1 as Chris Van Cuyk gained the decision over Lefty Gene Bearden. Bearden gave up three hits to five by Van Cuyk. Vern Kindsfater beat Bill Upton in the second game, which was a slugfest, Seattle winning, 7-6. Gene Hermanski's grand slam homer was the big one for the losers. Seattle's tie-breaking run came in the eighth as Artie Wilson singled, advanced on a sacrifice and scored on Kindsfater's blow to left field which Hermanski bobbled.

## Hurricane Gets Big Ring Chance Tonight

NEW YORK (AP)—If Hurricane Tommy Jackson ever is going to rate a title shot at heavyweight champ Rocky Marciano, tonight should tell the story.

The Hurricane, a restless 22-year Negro from New York, boxes Nino Valdes, the Cuban giant, in an important 16-round heavyweight bout at Madison Square Garden.

The match will be carried on network (CBS) television at 10 p.m. EDT.

Valdes, a 6 feet 3 and 207 pounds, is ranked No. 2 among Marciano's contenders, right behind Ezzard Charles although he beat Charles last year at Miami. Despite the high ranking, Jackson, the No. 5 boy, is favored.

Marciano is expected to give Charles a rematch in September, provided his eye cuts heal properly. If anything goes wrong with that match, tonight's winner would be ready to step in. A 1955 bout would be another possibility.

The Hurricane stirs up the fans more than any other new heavyweight has done in years. Either you think he is sensational or you think he can't fight a lick. The raves that followed his victories over Rex Layne, Clarence Henry and Dan Bucceroni turned to jeers when he was defeated by "spoiler" Jimmy Slade April 26. He regained some lost ground May 28 by stopping Charley Norkus in the Garden.

His record is 17-2-1 for 20 starts and Valdes' 30-8-2 for 49 pro bouts. The 29-year-old Cuban has won eight in a row, forcing the veteran Karel Slys to call quits in his last bout at Brussels May 22. He lost ground, however, in his last New York appearance, a lackluster decision over James J. Parker.
