

Pigeon Hunting Season Unchanged

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Fish and Wildlife Service announced Monday the 1954 shooting season on band-tailed pigeons will remain unchanged in Washington and Oregon from Sept. 1 to 30.

The agency said state game departments will select a season on mourning doves of 40 consecutive days or two periods of 20 days each.

Grange Hears Ullman Speech

"Reduction of parity price supports from 90 to 82 1/2 per cent, coupled with wheat acreage allotment of 30 per cent, will mean a multi-million dollar cut in eastern Oregon farm income," Al Ullman, candidate for Congress, told the Lake-Klamath Grange picnic Sunday.

"If the Senate goes along with the price support cuts approved by the House two weeks ago, the administration will have to accept responsibility for the farm income decline which will result," Ullman told the Grangers. "Part of the blame will have to be shouldered by the present Congressman from this district because he voted to permit reduction of price supports by 7 1/2 per cent."

Ullman arrived in Klamath Falls Monday after conferring Saturday with Adlai Stevenson, Democratic 1952 presidential candidate, in Eugene where Stevenson addressed a statewide Democratic rally.

Ullman will set up headquarters in the Stevens hotel to confer with Klamath county party workers regarding campaign activities during the next four days.
