## Priest Rapids Dam Approved

**WASHINGTON (AP)**—The House Tuesday accepted Senate amendments to a bill giving Washington State local interests two years to begin construction of Priest Rapids Dam.  
 The legislation now goes to the White House.  
 The bill, one of several approaches to the administration's "partnership" concept of power development, would permit either Grant County, Wash., Public Utility District, a group of such districts or the Washington State Power Commission to ask the Federal Power Commission for a license to build the project. If the license is not obtained within two years federal authorization for construction of the Columbia River power and flood control dam would be reinstated.  
 Under the bill, the local agency would pay the entire power cost—about 300 million. The federal government would pay flood control and navigation costs if it decides to undertake such work immediately. If not, the local agency would spend another 64 million to incorporate basic facilities for these purposes to which the government could add later.  
 The dam would have initial installed capacity of approximately 1,200,000 kilowatts and an ultimate capacity of approximately 1,500,000 kilowatts.

## Red Trade Union Issues Protest

**BERLIN (AP)**—The Communist Federation of Trade Unions in East Germany has protested in a letter to the secretary general of the United Nations against "brutal Fascist terror" in Guatemala.  
 The five-million-member organization charged that 45 union officials have been murdered. It demanded that the U.N. Security Council meet immediately to agree on actions against the "raging of military dictatorship in Guatemala."

**SYDNEY, Australi (AP)**—Rain-swollen rivers flooded northern New South Wales Wednesday for the second time this year. Hundreds of persons fled their homes.

## Dairy Support Fight Seen

**WASHINGTON (AP)**—A fight is expected in the Senate next week over an attempt to raise minimum dairy support prices in the new farm bill.  
 Dairy products now are supported at from 75 to 90 per cent of parity. The House in passing the farm bill July 2, voted to raise the minimum from 75 to 80 per cent, beating down a move to raise it to 90.  
 The Senate Agriculture Committee has voted to increase the minimum supports on butter, cheese and other dairy products to 85 per cent of parity.  
 Dairy state senators hope to get the support of other farm state members to uphold the committee action.  
 The farm bill as passed by the House calls for a flexible system of supports ranging from 82 1/2 to 90 per cent of parity for five of the six basics—wheat, corn, cotton, peanuts and rice. The sixth basic, tobacco, would continue to receive 90 per cent support.
