Changes in Social Law Refused

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower suffered a setback Tuesday when the Senate Finance Committee turned down compulsory social security coverage for 5,000,000 farm operators and 590,000 professionals.

The committee, working behind closed doors on the administration's big social security bill, voted to allow persons in those groups to decide for themselves whether they want to be covered.

However, several committee members said Wednesday other main provisions in the bill probably will emerge just about as the President wants them.

Meanwhile, the Senate itself passed 78-3 a bill for the first time would earmark all the proceeds of the federal unemployment compensation tax for the federal-state jobless aid program.

Before the bill was passed, the Senate rejected 56-39 an effort by Sen. Kennedy (D-Mass.), 15 other Democrats and Sen. Morse (Ind-Ore) to boost unemployment compensation benefits about 40 percent.

U.S. Farm Crop Report Announced

A highlight of the past week's happenings in agriculture was the release of the crop report by the U.S. Department of Agriculture on July 9. That date marked the best indication so far as to what and how much is coming from the nation's farms this year in the way of food, feed and fiber crops.

At this date, the pointer is set toward the fourth largest crop volume on record. If average conditions hold, it could turn out to be only slightly under 1952 and 1953, but about three per cent short of the 1948 high.

Feed grains make up the largest part of the crop total this year. The second largest crop, an above average barley crop, and a record oat crop are expected. The third largest hay crop is on the way. It is spread out a little more favorably, too, than the 1953 crop was. Only the severe drought areas will be short of needs.

With acreage controls on wheat, food grains will make up a smaller part of the crop volume. The total wheat crop, while below average, is still adding to wheat growers' problems. A crop of around 988 million bushels was in sight on July 1.

On a regional basis, farmers reported an area of severe drought in the western part of the central and southern Great Plains, and another in Texas. Most of the rest of the country looks pretty good. The North Atlantic and North Central regions report crops looking better than average. The South Atlantic, South Central, and Western regions are a little below average.

These estimates are based on conditions as they looked to the farmers on July 1.
