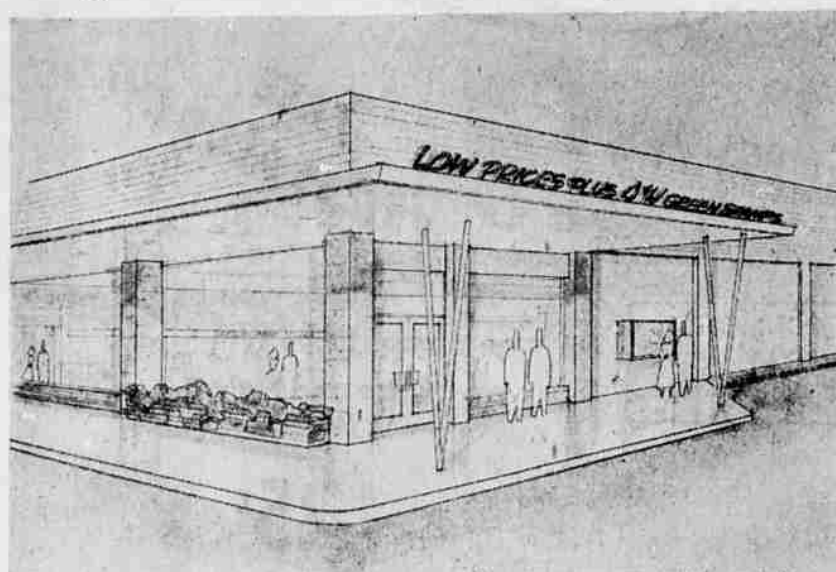

Food Prices Victims of Slashing

Probably the most astonishing crime ever perpetrated in Klamath Falls against the high cost of living is taking place at Oregon Food Stores. Dozens of grocery items will go under the axe in a price-cutting spree expected to benefit every homemaker in Klamath Falls and surrounding area.

Joe Fales Admits Guilt, Explains Lust for Volume

Admits Guilt!

"Actions Justified" Claim Accused... Mr. and Mrs. Buying Public to Direct Defense

Quiet, mild-mannered Joe Fales sat in his office at Oregon Food Store today and calmly told his story. The owner of Klamath Falls three largest independent food stores is charged with committing murder against the high cost of living.

The accused man readily admitted his guilt. Although there were accomplices who worked with him, he said the crime was instigated by him and carried out under his direction.

Speaking in a clear, unwavering voice, Fales explained his motives.

"The reasons for this action are quite clear," he said. "We buy from week to week and are therefore able to keep our stocks balanced at all times. We have no middleman or warehouse expense and this means lower handling

costs on every item. Decreased handling costs mean lower overhead which is passed on to the consumer in the form of rock-bottom prices on almost every item."
