



PEACHES, apricots and cherries are getting a big play at Mallory's Y Market which is having its grand opening at the Lakeview-Merrill junction. As Harold Mallory remarked, "The fresh peach season is always shorter than we expect it to be, so it isn't too early to begin thinking about canning."

Thirst Quenchers

A tall, frosty glass of lemonade is a wonderful mid-afternoon thirst quencher.

For those who prefer to serve lemonade made from fresh lemons, allow 2 tablespoons of fresh lemon juice, 2 tablespoons sugar and 1 cup of water for each tall, ice-clinking glass of refreshing lemonade. Mix lemon juice with sugar; stir to dissolve sugar, then add water. Serve with lots of ice and garnish with a plump lemon wedge.

JIFFY LEMONADE
Make and mix ahead of time, cover tightly in a glass jar and keep in the refrigerator. Combine 2 cups fresh lemon juice with 4 teaspoons grated lemon peel and 1½ cups sugar. When ready to serve, pour ¼ cup of this syrup into each chilled glass and fill with ice cubes and water.

VARIATIONS
Dress up lemonade glasses to charm your guests. The addition of 1 tablespoon crushed berries in a glass of icy cold lemonade turns it into a luscious pink color.
For a new sweetening trick, try using honey for sugar in your standard lemonade.

A light, frothy soda is yours in a minute when you substitute carbonated water for tap water in lemonade and add your favorite ice cream.

Top off regular lemonade with a delicious sherbert for a delectable and sparkling float or punch.
Make a Julep by crushing a sprig of fresh mint with two tablespoons sugar in a tall glass. Add two tablespoons fresh lemon juice and stir until sugar dissolves. Pour in one cup cold water and fill glass with ice cubes.

GARNISHES
Try an orange slice for variety on the rim of a tall frosty glass of lemonade. Fresh mint leaves or green and red maraschino cherries are a colorful addition.

For a frosty lemonade glass, dip the rim of the glass in lemon juice, then in powdered sugar. Chill, right side up, until edges are frosted.
Add fancy ice cubes to your lemonade by filling ice tray one-third full of water, adding a twist of lemon peel or maraschino cherry in each section and freeze. When firm, fill the rest of tray with water and continue freezing.

There's no diluting of that satisfying lemon flavor when you use lemonade ice cubes. Just pour plain lemonade into ice trays and freeze and use for chilling the frosty drinks.

DELICIOUS SPREAD
Try combining one-third cup maple-blended syrup with ½ cup peanut butter for a spread for crackers, bread or toast.

Soup Scoops

Soup gives the recommended "warm heart" to a cold meal; or it can be a cold specialty like jellied consommé. A sandwich or a sandwich - and - salad fills up the corners for appetites and gives a happy contrast of flavor and texture to the soup.
The following suggestions come from the Director of Home Economics for Campbell Soup Company:

CHEESE SOUP
For a summer lunch, serve soup. And remember cheese is a welcome addition to a can of soup. Use the new semi-liquid cheese spread that blends so easily. Try it in celery soup. First mix 1 can of condensed cream of celery soup with 1 can of water. Stir in ½ cup of cheese spread. Heat until blended and hot; stir occasionally, but do not boil. There you have three cups of luscious rich soup. Enjoy it with a peach salad for lunch.

CHILLED SOUP
Eat soup to cool yourself. The trick is to chill soup and serve

it icy cold when you want a refreshing meal. Asparagus soup is delightful this way. Mix 1 can condensed cream of asparagus soup with 1 can of milk. Put this in the refrigerator to chill well before mealtime - about 4 hours will insure thorough chilling. Serve the creamy asparagus combination into cold bowls. Sprinkle top with chopped parsley or watercress. Mighty tasty with egg salad sandwiches or pimiento cheese.

DANDY ASPIC

An easy way to make an A-1 tomato aspic is this: Start with just two ingredients, a can of mixed vegetable juices and gelatin. Open 1 can (12 ounce size) of mixed vegetable juices. Soften 1 envelope unflavored gelatin in ¼ cup of the juices; set aside. Heat remaining juices; stir in the softened gelatin. Rinse 1 large salad mold (or 4 small ones) with cold water; pour in mixture and chill until firm. Trim with crisp lettuce. Serve with a top-knot of mayonnaise or cottage cheese or sour cream. Makes four servings.

Crisscross Peach Pie

Combine 2½ to 3 tablespoons quick-cooking tapioca with ¼ cup granulated sugar (or ½ cup granulated sugar and ½ cup firmly packed brown sugar), ¼ teaspoon salt, 4 cups sliced fresh peaches, and 1 to 2 tablespoons lemon juice. Pour filling into a 9-inch pie pan lined with pastry. Dot with butter. Adjust pastry strips in lattice across top of pie. Press ends to edge of bottom crust. Flute edge. Bake at 425 degrees 45 to 50 minutes or until syrup boils with heavy bubbles that do not burst. Serve warm with a spoonful of vanilla or peach ice cream on each serving.
Note: Use 3 tablespoons of tapioca if the pie is to be served warm; 2½ if it is being made for later use when it is cooled.

COOL MOLDED SALAD
Dissolve a package of lime flavored gelatin in 1 cup hot water. Add cup cold water and chill. When partially set, fold in 1 cup dry cottage cheese (we like the variety that is not creamed), and 1 cup diced fruit of your choice (canned fruit cocktail, if you wish), and ½ cup each chopped salted almonds and mayonnaise. Turn into mold and chill until firm.

VEGETABLE SALADS
Grated new turnips and grated raw carrots, tossed with mayonnaise, and seasoned to taste, is a wonderful vegetable salad combination. You can give the old-fashioned grated carrot and raisin salad a new taste by tossing it with a honey and lemon dressing. Use ¼ cup honey and 2 tablespoons lemon juice, mixing thoroughly.



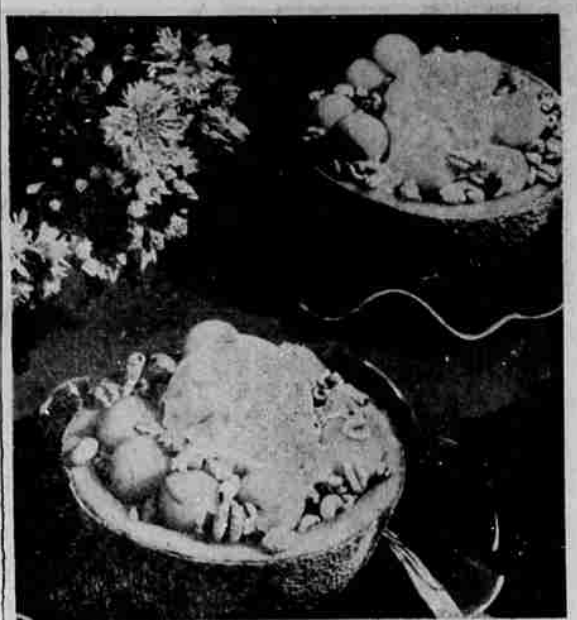
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FRUIT PLATTER

In tropical climates the fruit platter appears at every breakfast and frequently for other meals. Chilled melon slices, with rind removed, chunks of fresh pineapple, fresh strawberries unhulled and any other combination your imagination suggests can be made into attractive arrangements. It is not unusual to see three types of melon slices - watermelon, cantaloupe or Persian melon and honey dew. Always serve several wedges of fresh lime - the lemon of the Latin American countries.

CREAMED HAM ON RICE

You can achieve an almost Oriental flavor with this dish. Cook a bowlful of fluffy rice. To a can of condensed mushroom soup, add ½ can water, 1 small can mushroom pieces and liquid, 1 cup finely diced ham and ¾ cup finely diced celery, including tops. Correct seasoning - probably all it will need is a dash of pepper. Serve over hot rice.
