The summer tourist season is in full swing, but the shadow of school days is just around the corner. In view of this, a recent group of visitors in Klamath Falls was a natural.

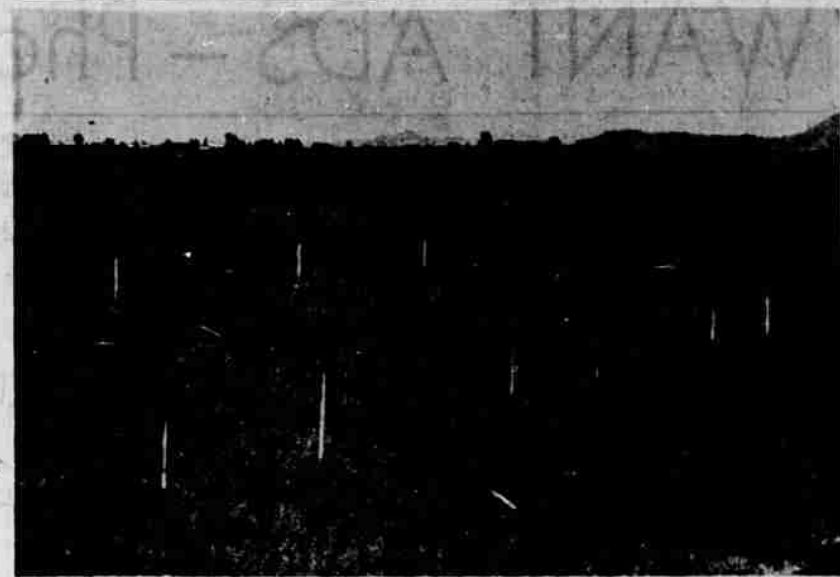
The guests, a group of 22 Dallas, Texas, elementary teachers, stopped at the Willard Hotel Tuesday night en route to Victoria and Lake Louise.

Soil Field Day Planned

The annual Klamath Experimental Area field day will be held Monday, July 26, starting at 1:30 p.m. Visitors to the station this year will see an increased amount of crops and soils research work. In orange crops, increased emphasis is being placed on pasture mixtures. The grasses and legumes used in these mixtures are those that have shown promise in previous testing.

A new introductory nursery for new and improved strains and varieties of grasses and legumes will be shown. A new alfalfa variety trial was seeded last year with many of the newer varieties developed in this and other countries that appear to have promise, he stated.

The soils research program has been intensified, with emphasis on soil moisture tests and irrigation, according to A. R. Halvorsen who is in charge of soils and fertilizer work and research. Also the minor element problems of the Lower Klamath muck soils is being intensively investigated. These and alkali soil reclamation plots will be shown during the field day.

Stockman Enters Plumas Show

QUINCY, California, July 14 (Special)—Dale West, Merrill, Oregon, is among early entrants in the livestock division of the Plumas County Fair and Centennial Celebration August 12 through 15, officials announced today.

West, who will exhibit purebred Aberdeen Angus beef cattle, is well known in Pacific Coast show circles and breeding associations. He will compete with more than 170 exhibitors for \$15,000 in livestock prize money.

The Plumas County Fair, holding undisputed claim to "California's greatest range cattle show," also hosts Pacific Logger's championships at their mid-August event.

Other phases of the four-day event include gold panning contests, championship rodeo, horse show, and historic pageant portraying development of Plumas County.

House Approves Talent Project

WASHINGTON (AP)—The House Interior Committee Tuesday approved a bill to authorize construction of the Talent division of the Rogue River Basin Reclamation Project in Oregon.

The project would irrigate some 18,000 acres near Medford. It would cost an estimated \$22,900,000.

A measure to authorize construction of the \$1,600,000 Haystack Reservoir to regulate the flow of the Deschutes River for the benefit of the Deschutes Reclamation Project in Oregon also was approved by the committee.

Green Lumber Prices Lower

PORTLAND (AP)—Crow's Lumber Digest, authoritative trade journal, said Tuesday that prices for green dimension lumber climbed to a near record price at the start of the lumber strike but now have skidded down again.

But, said the publication, it appears that strong demand will continue to give a steady support to prices through the fall.

It said prices climbed to a peak of \$35 net to mills for No. 2 green dimension two weeks ago, in part due to fear buying.

After most pressing needs were filled, many retail yards stopped buying because of the high price. The price then started down again. The Digest said, and has now dropped to around \$22 a thousand—about what it was when the strike started but still \$5 or \$9 higher than when strike talk first became a factor in April.

Some buyers are turning to British Columbia for their lumber—but are finding prices about the same as here, the Digest said. A surprisingly large amount of lumber is coming from Northwest mills which are either non-union or have settled, the publication continued, and said estimates of carloadings are close to 70 per cent of normal.

Sale of timber, Klamath Indian Reservation. Sealed bids in duplicate on forms provided therefore, marked outside, "Bid Eldon and Polly Adair Allotment Sale," addressed to the Superintendent, Klamath Indian Agency, Klamath Agency, Oregon, will be received until 2:00 p.m., Pacific Standard Time August 6, 1954 for the purchase of timber on two trust allotments comprising approximately 50 acres altogether of timber land.

Separate approved contracts must be made for timber to be cut on each allotment for which the authority to sell the timber has been obtained from the owners. The allotments contain an estimated stand to be cut which estimate is as follows: approximately 691,150 feet B.M. of ponderosa pine, 30,900 feet B.M. of lodgepole pine, and 5180 feet B.M. of white fir. Each bidder must state the price per thousand feet B.M. Scribner Decimal C Log scale that will be paid for timber to be cut and scaled from the two allotments as a whole. No bid will be considered for less than \$15.50 per thousand feet B.M. of ponderosa pine, \$5.00 per thousand feet B.M. for lodgepole pine, and \$5.00 per thousand feet B.M. for white fir. A certified check in the amount of 20 per cent of the total bid price on a solvent bank, payable to the Treasurer of the United States must accompany each bid. The deposits will be returned to the unsuccessful bidders. The deposit of the unsuccessful bidder will be held in lieu of bond in proportion to the value of timber on each allotment pending satisfactory completion of the terms of each of the contracts, or retained as liquidated damages if the bidder shall not execute the respective contracts within 30 days from acceptance of his bid. The right to waive technical defects and to reject any and all bids is reserved. The contracts will specify that all designated timber shall be cut and removed from the unit on or before March 31, 1955, and that all other requirements of the contract, including slash disposal, will be completed on or before December 31, 1955. An additional payment, in the amount of 20 per cent of the estimated value at the bid price will be required on each individual contract before cutting begins and in any case not later than thirty days from the date of approval of the respective individual contracts. The contractor will be required to deck logs in advance of scaling or to conduct logging operations in such other manner that will permit the scaling of timber in as few scaling assignments as possible. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale, and the submission of bids, should be obtained from the Superintendent, Klamath Indian Agency, Klamath Agency, Oregon, or the Area Director, Indian Service Interior Building, 1001 N.E.
