### Lodge Predicts Red China Veto

NEW YORK (AP) — Henry Cabot Lodge, chief U. S. delegate to the United Nations, says the arguments against seating Red China in the U. N. are strong enough to block such a move even without a U. S. veto.

Lodge told a CBS television audience Sunday he could not conceive of Communist China being seated. "It flies in the face of principle," he said. "They will be kept out. I don't think we will have to use the veto even in the Security Council. It's the arguments that will keep them out."

The ambassador declined to say directly whether the United States should leave the U. N. if Red China were seated. He indicated, however, that he thought this would be unwise.

### Two Pedestrians Killed By Auto

OAKLAND, Ore. (AP) — Two picnickers walking on the highway were struck and instantly killed by a car driven by William E. Ellison, 24, of Umpqua, Sunday night, state police here reported Monday.  
The victims were Charles Roland Andrus, 20, Roseburg, and Ramona Harris Degette, 19, Winston, Ore. Ellison was lodged in the Roseburg jail, but no charge had been filed early Monday.

Deputy Coroner Vernon Little of Roseburg said the couple had been picnicking about three miles north of here. They apparently were walking toward Oakland when Ellison's car, rounding a curve, struck them. The bodies were hurled 150 feet, Little said.  
Ellison told police he did not see the couple in time to avoid striking them. The couple's car, with a tire flat, was found beside the highway a short distance away, and Little said he believed they were walking to Oakland for assistance.

### British Protest Aid To Egypt

MADRID, Spain (AP) — Britain has protested Spanish shipment of small arms to Egypt, a spokesman for the British embassy here said Monday.  
An American embassy spokesman declined comment on reports that the United States was associated with the British representations. Other reliable sources, however, said these reports were not true.

It could not be learned how large the shipments were or whether there would be more in the future. Persons in a position to know said a freighter left Barcelona several weeks ago with a cargo of small arms in packing cases marked "sewing machines."  
Reports published abroad setting the total value of the deal at \$12 million dollars were considered high here. It was believed a contract of this size would overtax Spain's armament industry already hard at work modernizing weapons for the Spanish army and fulfilling "off-shore" orders of the U.S. government.

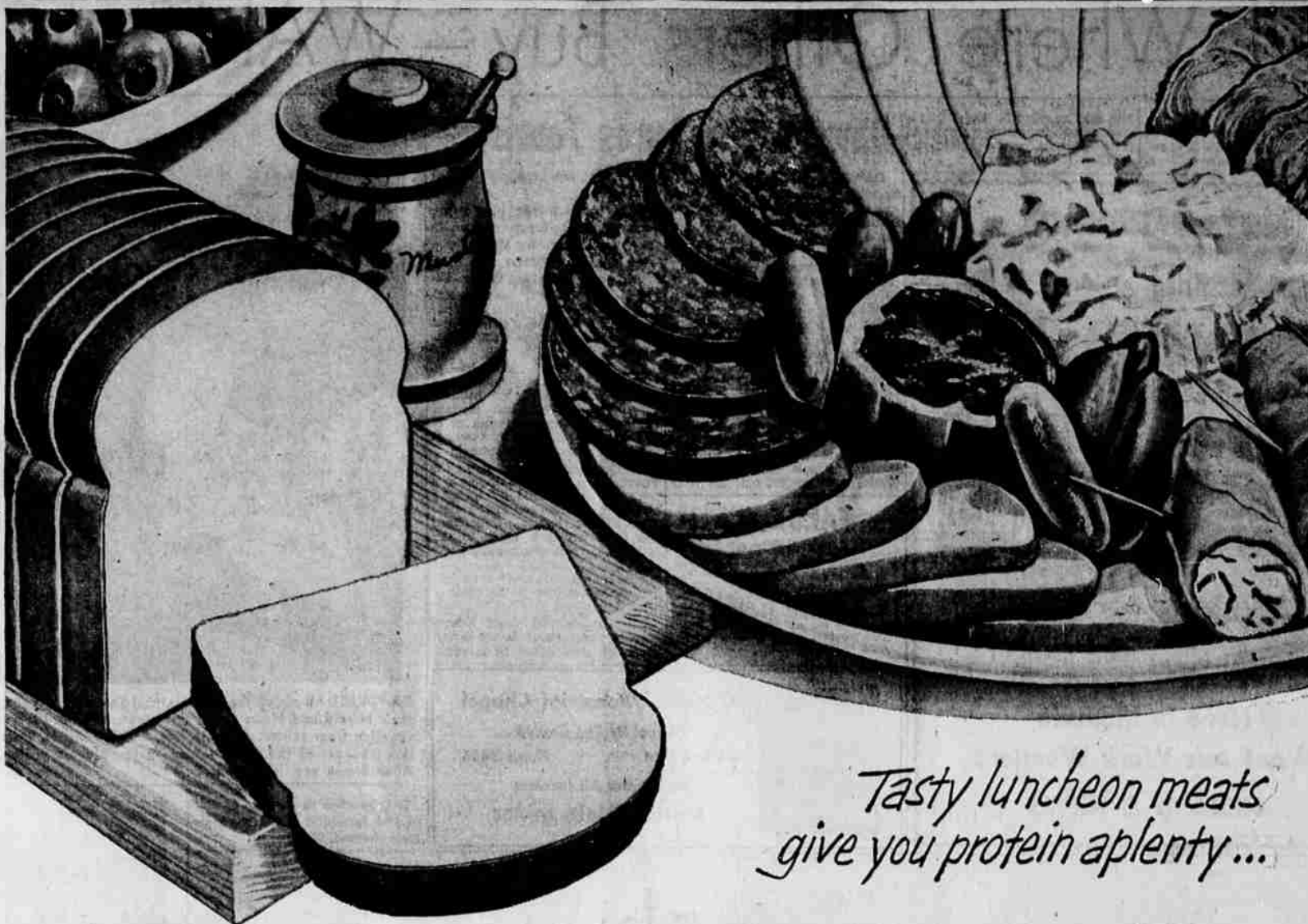

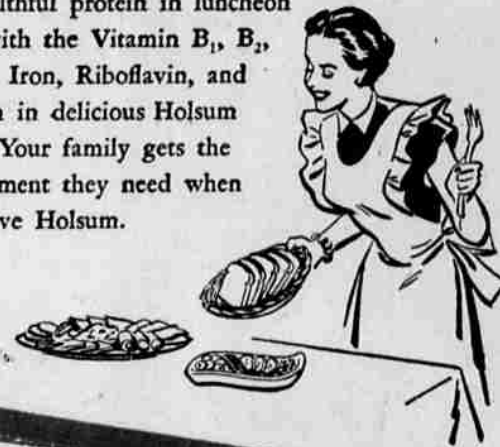
