Small Town Bank Closed

VALLEY CENTER, Kan. (AP)—Merchants and others in this community of 1,100 were stunned yesterday when they went to their town's only bank and found it closed. Bank Commissioner Elmer T. Beck said bank losses would exceed \$310,000.

The doors of the Farmers and Merchants State Bank were closed following a week's investigation by state bank examiners. Depositors had no hint that anything was wrong. Beck said John W. Basore, the bank's president, had admitted irregularities and had promptly resigned.

After announcing the probable loss, Beck said he would have no further comment until his report is complete.

Some merchants were caught with Saturday and Sunday receipts and no place to immediately put them. Some of them had a hard time rounding up change so they

could open up this morning. L. R. Berry, hardware store operator, said gloomily, "I might as well have stayed closed today. No one wanted to buy anything. They just wanted to talk about the bank."

There have been no arrests or

charges filed. County Atty. Warner Moore was trying to find Basore, who he said had not been at the bank all day

and was not at his home. Beck said the bank is not protected by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corp.

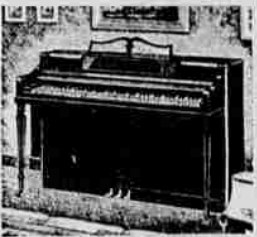

Indian Roads Plan Announced

WASHINGTON (AP)—Washington, Oregon and Idaho will share in a 10-million dollar program for improving and maintaining Indian reservation roads announced Monday by Secretary of the Interior McKay.

Allocations proposed in the program include \$850,000 for the three Northwest states. The program was outlined in a request to Congress for a supplemental appropriation of \$3,900,000. The Interior Department said it already has \$2,897,000 for road construction and \$2,043,000 for maintenance on reservations. In addition, it also plans to use contract authority totaling \$1,161,000 provided by the Federal Aid Highway Act.
