The neon sign with the name change is being put up this week. A complete redecorating job in all the rooms and the lobby is being completed. A penthouse and three room apartment tops the building, owned by A. B. Collins.

ATHENS, Greece (AP) — Foreign Minister Stephanos Stephanopoulos said Turkey has agreed on the urgency of a meeting of Yugoslav, Greek and Turkish foreign ministers for the signing of their alliance pact.

Stephanopoulos said yesterday the three governments would immediately begin talks to set a time for the meeting.

### Church Plans Camp Meeting

The annual State Camp meeting of the Church of God in Oregon will convene July 23 to August 1, according to an announcement by Chairman Marvin E. Petersen. The meeting is held on the Nazarene Conference Grounds on 2nd Ave. a few miles south of Portland. Leading features of the Camp Meeting include Biblical exposition and evangelistic preaching, the annual business meeting of the Association of the Churches of God in Oregon, special meeting of the Women's Missionary Society, Ministers' meetings, daily Christian education conferences, a full youth program and a camp for children.

The conference brings to Oregon as guest evangelist the Rev. G. Herbert Joiner, Whittier, California. Other leaders on the staff include Dr. John W. V. Smith, professor of Biblical literature at Anderson Seminary, Anderson, Indiana; the Rev. and Mrs. Robert Clark, missionaries from Pakistan; Everett Minkler, song leader from Los Angeles, California; the Rev. Tom A. Smith, national youth director of Anderson, Indiana. The Rev. Edgar L. Busch, newly appointed Oregon State Evangelist and field man will collaborate with Dr. A. P. Gray in the "Oregon for Christ Day" and in presenting the new extension and outreach program. Clarence C. Perry Jr., Eugene, is manager of the conference and the Rev. Gene Linamen of Aloha is secretary. Three general services will be held each day and all these are open to the public.

## Minority Vote Opposes Dam

WASHINGTON (AP) — A minority report from the Senate Public Works Committee Tuesday opposing "partnership" construction of Cougar Dam on the South McKenzie River in Oregon, was signed by Sens. Morse of Oregon, Chavez (D-NM), and Gore (D-Tenn.).

The committee majority recently approved the bill which would permit joint construction of the project by Army Engineers and the Eugene (Ore.) Water and Electric Board.

The three senators said they opposed the legislation because it "is a potential precedent for similar and more devastating plans which could destroy orderly and full development of the Columbia River Basin." The committee, they added, "did not consider the disruptive impact of the so-called partnership proposal... upon the carefully developed plans for comprehensive, regional water resource development in the Pacific Northwest."

They contended the committee should have held hearings on a bill by Morse and 15 other senators for construction of the Cougar project by the federal government. They also objected to the committee's refusal to hold hearings in the field on Cougar and on similar "partnership" proposals for Priest Rapids, Green Peter and John Adam s.

Scratches and bruises on her body and the disarray of her blue jeans and plaid shirt led officers to speculate she was killed while resisting sexual advances. Friends of the dead girl said she had been seeing Stefanich secretly for two years. One of them, Carol Bishop, 20, said she once told her that "if anything happens to me, look for Tony."

The dead girl's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ronald Bogart of Joliet, learned of their daughter's death while visiting with Mrs. Bogart's mother across Puget Sound from Seattle.

Near collapse from grief, they made immediate plane reservations for the return trip to Joliet. "Doris was a good girl," her mother said tearfully, "and all of her dates were with boys around her own age.
