Red Chinese Still Hold R. Applegate

Mr. and Mrs. Frank Applegate, Medford, parents of Dick Applegate, have received replies from governors of 30 of the 48 states, assuring them of assistance in efforts to have their son freed from Red China.
Dick Applegate has been prisoner of the Communists since March 1953, when he and two others were taken prisoner aboard his yacht near Hong Kong.
The elder Applegates wrote to 48 governors June 4 to ask them to request the U.S. State Department to maintain its efforts to secure Dick's release. Among the letters was one from Gov. Thomas Dewey of New York who said he had telephoned the State Department on Dick's behalf.
Gov. Paul Patterson of Oregon has written the Applegates several times and has been extremely helpful, Mrs. Applegate said. She added that last week they received permission to send personal articles and necessities to Dick, and they sent off a package of medicines, toilet articles and clothing.
The Applegates have not heard directly from their son since he was first reported missing.
"But," Mrs. Applegate said, "if all the prayers that are being said for Dick mean anything, he'll be released soon."

Dick Applegate was born in Klamath Falls and is a member of a pioneer Southern Oregon family. He was an NBC broadcaster at the time of his capture of Hong Kong in 1953.
